MARY, THE HOLY MOTHER OF GOD: JANUARY 1, 2017 CELEBRATING THE YEAR OF THE FAMILY Pastoral Reflections

This year here at St. Ann and Native Peoples' Mission as we celebrate the Year of the Family. Let us dedicate our Year under the patronage of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. This week let's spend some time in reflecting on our Christian family life. A family is a basic unit of a social life and so it is also basic to our Christian life. The Second Vatican Council Documents calls "*a Christian family as a domestic Church.*" The Church gets its nature and growth from a family. We all belong to that one family of God.

Today we are given a model family to follow in the Holy Family. Many holy paintings depict Jesus Mary and Joseph as holy people with a hollow around them. It is true they were holy people but lived a normal family life. Like any one of us they had to deal with all the family struggles – from making difficult marriage decisions, finding a safe-place in a troubled political system, running away to Egypt as refugees, finding a new home in Nazareth, hard-labourers as a carpenter, experienced death of the father with a young teenage boy, then when Jesus grows up, he was not accepted by his society and later condemned to die on the cross. In this family we meet a father who was hard-working, just and protector of the wife and son. We meet a mother who supported her husband with care and love, and her Son in his mission to proclaiming God's kingdom. We meet a Son who knowing that He is the Son of God still lived in humility and obedience to his earthy parents. They are true model to us to live our life in the family not because they had no difficulties but because they in spite of their struggles, never gave up their **faith** in God, their **love** for each other, their **hope** for others in the world.

As we reflect on the life in the Holy Family let's reflect on our family – our relationships, our struggles, our love and concern for each other, our faith in God, and our hope for the future of our family, our church, our society and the world.

Gracious God, help us to imitate the example of the Holy Family. Amen. Jesus, Mary, Joseph – pray for us

Full of faith, you conceived Jesus first in your heart and then in your womb, and thus became the Mother of all believers. Send us, O Mother, your blessing on this day consecrated to your honour. Show us the face of Jesus your Son, who bestows upon the entire world mercy and peace. Amen.
