### **On Family Prayer**

Reflections by Fr. Wilson Andrade, CSC

A recent research by the Holy Cross Family ministries shows that 64% of the catholic families do not have family prayers. This is a sad reality of our modern day families. This year let us make a habit of praying together as a family. The Second Vatican Council asserts that "a family is a domestic church" then let's make our domestic church – a house of prayer and peace. Pope Francis in his address to the young families asked them "to teach children with examples of faith" In fact this is the promise we take during every baptism celebration of the children. It is

*faith.*" In fact this is the promise we take during every baptism celebration of the children. It is our Christian responsibility to teach everyone faith by our example and life. One of the best ways of *teaching faith by example* happens when families gather for prayer.

**Family Prayer is a grace**: God's grace is freely given to all. In our family prayer, we can acknowledge many God's graces we have received. Let our family prayer be genuine, said with simple words of gratitude and appreciation. There are traditional prayers or modern prayer that help us to begin our prayer life in the family, but those prayers must direct us to a true – heart to heart – conversation with God and others. Prayer leads us to share God's blessings with everyone especially with the younger generations. The blessings from the elders is a powerful expression God's grace to everyone.

<u>Family Prayer is a discipline</u>: It requires time, place, and motivation. It is always useful to find a suitable time to pray when everyone is together - before the meal or even while going to work. It is good to make a habit of praying – not once in a while but every day. Even though we are busy with many things in life, we can always find time to pray together. If someone is not physical present, still we can pray for that person!!

<u>Family prayer brings Unity and Peace</u>: Praying makes us humble. Humility helps us to acknowledge life and gifts of others in our life. Let prayer help us to experience a sense of freedom and love within our family and friends. Self-criticism or judging others is not a prayer. Prayer brings us peace by applying balm of forgiveness mixed with love. Prayer brings unity among the family members with better discernment for decision making, co-operation for the common good, understanding during failures, forgiveness for faults, support during times of struggles and laughter during joyful events.

May the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph guide us and May Sts. Anne and Joachim intercede for us. Amen
