In the Gospel, the beatitudes challenge how we live in our today's society. They challenge our cultural experiences and confront our selfish attitudes so we can live a blessed life in the kingdom of God.

Culture preaches to have more, to become richer, have more money,

Christ says to be poor in spirit then you win the heaven.

Culture says to enjoy the instant happiness,

Christ says blessed are you when you cry and sweat for your happiness.

Culture says to become powerful and great,

Christ says to be humble to be a servant.

Culture says use any corrupt and unjust means your gain

Christ says –use the just means, be a righteous person.

Culture says if someone wrongs you, condemn them, sue them, punish them

Christ says be merciful, be forgiving

Culture says when someone attacks you fight back

Christ says be a peace maker, say a word of peace

Reflections on Beatitudes

The saints are blessed because they were faithful and meek and cared for others. The best description of the saints—in fact, their "identity card"— is found in the beatitudes from Jesus' Sermon on the Mount, which begins, "Blessed are the poor in spirit." As Christian saints have done throughout the ages, Christ's followers today are called "to confront the troubles and anxieties of our age with the spirit and love of Jesus."

New situations require new energy and a new commitment, a new list of beatitudes for modern Christians:

- "Blessed are those who remain faithful while enduring evils inflicted on them by others and forgive them from their heart.
- "Blessed are those who look into the eyes of the abandoned and marginalized and show them their closeness.
- "Blessed are those who see God in every person and strive to make others also discover God.
- "Blessed are those who protect and care for our common home.
- "Blessed are those who renounce their own comfort in order to help others.
- "Blessed are those who pray and work for full communion between Christians."
- "All these are messengers of God's mercy and tenderness, surely they will receive from God their merited reward."
