

PARISH COMMUNITY OF ST. ANN JOURNEY FORWARD IN GOD'S HOUSEHOLD

Everyone knows the parable of the mustard seed (Mk 4:30-32). Many interpret its message as "a little faith will go a long ways." But did you know that the mustard seed Jesus refers to, when planted, grows into a weed–one so prolific and hardy that farmers could do little to eradicate it?

For those of us who would not know, as the mustard seed grows and ages, it siphons more nutrients from the soil, making it difficult for anything else to grow; and if it is eaten, its bitter leaves can wreak havoc on the digestive system. When Jesus spoke about the mustard seed, he likened it to the beautiful and robust Lebanon Cedar referred to in Ezekiel 17:22-2. In this



passage, the prophet uses the image of the cedar to describe the future Israel, and its temple, as a place of refuge for all people's, who are symbolized by the "birds of every kind" in need of a place to nest. The prophet then points out that God will "... bring down the high tree, exalt the low tree, dry up the green tree and make the dry tree flourish. I am the LORD; I have spoken, and I will perform it."

Jesus is intentionally comparing the kingdom of God (the Cedar mentioned in Ezekiel) to a menacing weed because, like the weed, the kingdom is so prolific and all-consuming that many who encounter it won't want anything to do with it. Jesus is also pointing out that, like the weed, the kingdom of God will be, for some, a "bitter pill" to swallow.

Jesus describes this menacing weed that comes from the mustard seed as a big tree (cedar), a great place for birds to build their nests. But for some, the mustard seed, like the kingdom of God, will be thought of as a menacing weed, causing more harm than good, yet it is a place of refuge as well as an unstoppable force for positive change.

In other words, God has little concern for conventionalism–the way things have always been done. The "cedar" that God plants, through Jesus, is both shocking and new, menacing and wonderful. As Jesus said, "Those who have ears to hear, let them hear" (Mk 4:9).
