A Short reflection on - Laudato Sii

Pope Francis's revolutionary new encyclical calls for a "broad cultural revolution" to confront the environmental crisis. "Laudato Sii" is also quite lengthy. Here is the short reflection on its key messages:

- 1) The spiritual perspective is now part of the discussion on the environment: The greatest contribution of "Laudato Sii" to the environmental dialogue is its systematic overview of the crisis from a religious point of view. From now on, the environmental dialogue will be framed not just with political, scientific and economic language but also, the language of faith enters the discussion—clearly, decisively and systematically.
- 2) The poor are disproportionately affected by climate change: The disproportionate effect of environmental change on the poor and on the developing world is highlighted in almost every section of the encyclical. The effects of climate change, with "worse impacts" are felt by those living in developing countries.
- 3) Less is more: Pope Francis critiques "technocratic" mindset, in which technology is seen as the "principal key" to human existence (No. 110) and offers a Christian spirituality growth marked by "moderation and the capacity to be happy with little" (No. 222).
- **4)** Catholic Social teaching now includes teaching on the environment. Pope Francis uses some of the traditional foundations of Catholic Social Teaching, particularly the idea of the "common good."
- 5) **Discussions about ecology can be grounded in the Bible and church tradition:** Pope Francis traces the theme of love for creation through the Old and New Testaments proclaiming the Gospel of Creation.
- **Everything is connected—including the economy:** Pope Francis points to St. Francis of Assisi, who shows how "inseparable the bond is between concern for nature, justice for the poor, commitment to society and interior peace" (No. 10).
- 7) Scientific research on the environment is to be praised and used: This encyclical accepts the "best scientific research available today" and builds on it, rather than entering into a specialist's debate (No. 15) but offers a place for dialogue.
- 8) Widespread indifference and selfishness worsen environmental problems: In the world of "Laudato Sii" there is no room for selfishness or indifference. One cannot care for the rest of nature "if our hearts lack tenderness, compassion and concern for our fellow human beings" (No. 91).
- 9) Global dialogue and solidarity are needed: Pope Francis draws from the experiences of people around the world, invites all people of the world to enter into a "new dialogue" and "honest debate" and not simply one within the Catholic Church (No. 14, 16). A global dialogue is also needed because there are "no uniform recipes."
- **10)** A change of heart is required: At heart, this document, addressed to "every person on the planet" is a call for a new way of looking at things, a "bold cultural revolution" (No. 3, 114). To use religious language, what the pope is calling for is conversion.
