# FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT: MARCH 26, 2017 CELEBRATING THE YEAR OF THE FAMILY

#### Pastoral Reflections By: Rev. Wilson Andrade, CSC

In this fourth Sunday of Lent we reflect on the Theme: Jesus is the Light of the World. In the Gospel we hear the story of healing of the blind man. The testimony he gives about that *Jesus is from God "one who opened the eyes of born blind man.*" The irony of this gospel story is that blind man could recognize that Jesus is the *"man from God,"* but the Pharisees who could physically see, think and teach the Laws of God were not able see that Jesus is the true light of the world. Jesus is the presence of God, "who leads us in right paths... to dwell in the house of God."

136 - 4

St. Paul, a born Pharisee, when his eyes were opened on the road to Damascus, becomes a strong believer in Jesus. He proclaims Jesus as the true light of the world and invites people saying "*once you were darkness but now in the Lord you are light, so live as the Children of the light.*" (Eph. 5.8) We are called to shine with Christ, radiating God's love in the world.

Today Jesus challenges our pharisaic attitude of self-righteousness and judging others. We need to open our eyes and look at the presence of God that we experience in the person of Jesus who becomes real to us in listening to the scriptures and in breaking of the bread and sharing of the cup. Let the Eucharist be a time for us to celebrate love of God.

We are the children of the light, cleansed and opened our eyes through the waters of Baptism; we pray that we may be able to see from the eyes of our hearts – the goodness of God and Glorify God saying: **Jesus is the Light of the World.** 

#### World Water Day: March 22

Pope Francis writes: "Even as the quality of available water is constantly diminishing, in some places there is a growing tendency, despite its scarcity, to privatize this resource, turning it into a commodity subject to the laws of the market. Yet access to safe drink able water is a basic and universal human right, since it is essential to human survival and, as such, is a condition for the exercise of other human rights. Our world has a grave social debt towards the poor who lack access to drinking water, because they are denied the right to a life consistent with their inalienable dignity." (*Laudato si* #30).

"The poor and needy search for water, but there is none; their tongues are parched with thirst. But I the Lord will answer them." (Isaiah 41:17)

Did you know that 884 million people live without access to safe clean drinking water? Water is a tangible expression of the good news we share. In the developing world, nothing is a better expression of God's love than safe drinking water and the life it offers—nothing, that is, except the love offered to us by Christ. Clean drinking water is good news for the health of children, the lives of women, education of the young, and the economies of the poor. A community transformed by the good news of life-giving water in Jesus' name is an easy place to embrace the good news of God's salvation.

Did you know? The Government of Ontario has proposed a two year moratorium on water taking permits that could help protect Ontario's water supply from bottled water companies like Nestlé. Let's put the pressure on and ensure that local water resources are protected, all proposals for new and expanded water-bottling facilities are rejected, and local indigenous leaders are involved in all decision-making concerning local water resources. Contact your local MPP or The Ontario Minister of the Environment, Glen R Murray, and speak out about the access of multinational corporations to water in Ontario! Water is not a commodity to be sold but is a human right for all! We can all help by refusing to purchase bottled water!
