

#### To believe in the Logic of the Resurrection of the Dead - Pope Francis

Christians are called to believe in the logic of the resurrection of the body and not succumb to heresies that reduce it to a mere spiritual experience, when looking toward the future, the uncertainty about what happens after death often can lead to not understanding Christianity's "logic of the future," which proclaims that believers will rise again in body and soul like Jesus did.

"A spiritualistic piety, a nuanced piety is much easier; but to enter into the logic of the flesh of Christ, this is difficult. And this is the logic of the day after tomorrow. We will resurrect like the risen Christ, with our own flesh. St. Paul's first letter to the Corinthians, in which the apostle admonishes some of the early Christian community for saying "there is no resurrection of the dead."

"If there is no resurrection of the dead, then neither has Christ been raised. And if Christ has not been raised, then empty, too, is our preaching; empty, too, your faith."

For some, it is difficult to understand and accept the "logic of the future" regarding what happens after death. The belief that, like Jesus, Christians will experience the resurrection of the body "is not easy."

"Yesterday's logic is easy, today's logic is easy. Tomorrow's logic is easy: We will all die. But the logic of the day after tomorrow, that is difficult," Some Christians "are afraid of the flesh" and may fall prey to "a certain type of Gnosticism" that reduces the resurrection to a purely spiritual experience; a belief that was "the first heresy" denounced by the apostle John.

Believing and having faith that Christ did not rise from the dead "as a ghost" but rather in flesh and blood is "the logic of the day after tomorrow that we find hard to understand,"

While it is a sign of maturity to see the logic of the resurrection, Christians must also pray for the grace to understand it. "You also need the great grace of the Holy Spirit to understand this logic of the day after tomorrow; after the transformation, when he will come and will carry us transformed above the clouds to be with him always. Let us ask the Lord for the grace of this faith."

### Sharelife: Thank you letter from Cardinal Collins

Cardinal Newman, who was canonized on October 13, took as his motto as a Cardinal: *cor ad cor loquitur* – heart speaks to heart. This phrase succinctly describes how to live a Christian life. It's not about "lips speaking to the ears" – what we tell others about our faith. Rather, it's the love we demonstrate through a heartfelt personal encounter, through which our neighbour physically experiences the love of the Lord God in our midst. One particular way heart speaks to heart is through our annual ShareLife appeal. For the second year in a row, our parishioners raised \$13 million for those in need.

With deep gratitude, I thank you and your parish community for all you have done for the success of our campaign. From the hard work of our priests, parish staff and volunteers, to the selfless generosity of our parishioners, each contribution represents an act of love.

Heart speaks to heart when a counsellor attentively listens to a widow expressing her grief. When an isolated senior makes a new friend at a drop-in program. When a social worker journeys with a man recovering from addiction. These are not cold interactions, but matters of the heart. Likewise, supporting ShareLife is not an unfeeling act of obligation.

It is a manifestation of the Living God: "just as you did it to one of the least of these, you did it to me." Your support of ShareLife is bringing God's love to those in greatest need, here in our archdiocese and around the world.
