All Souls Day: Month of November 2020: Year of Joy

During the Month of November, we will remember and pray for all the people who have died in our family, our community and the world. We pray and support all people who are grieving at the death of a loved one.

All Souls' Day in the Catholic Church, a day for commemoration of all the faithful departed and praying for the repose the souls. The church believes that the prayers of the faithful on earth will help to receive final rest for the faithful departed and find peace in God's mercy and love.

The faithful are encouraged to offer Requiem (Memorial) Masses, offer Prayers, (Novena Masses, Liturgy of the Hours for the Dead, Rosary) Visit and pay respect at the graves of the loved ones by decorating with flowers, sprinkling of the Holy Water, and lighting of candles.

Many people also do penance of fasting and offering food to the poor and hungry and other charitable works to remember and continue the legacy of their loved ones. This year we ask you as a concrete gesture of this memorial, we welcome you to light a candle before the altar and pray for them. Please consider buying a Vigil Candle (**Cost: \$5.00**) and write the name of the person in the **All Souls Day Envelopes** are given at the entrance of the Church. We continue to offer masses for all the faithful departed members of our family, friends, and members of St. Ann and Native Peoples Mission. **May they Rest in Peace.**

CHRIST THE KING: NOVEMBER 22, 2020 CELEBRATING THE YEAR OF JOY

The Feast of Christ the King

Pastoral reflections by: Fr. Wilson Andrade, CSC

Every Christian receives the Threefold ministries of Christ who is **Priest, Prophet and King** during his/her baptismal day, when the priest or deacon anoints with the oil of Sacred Chrism on our foreheads. So we are called **priestly (praying), prophetic (preaching) and royal (serving)** people of God. We are anointed like 'David was anointed as king' (2 Sam. 5:3). So we share in the kingship of Jesus in our Baptism.

Today as we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King, we reflect on the Kingship of Jesus. Jesus Christ is the King and Lord of the Creation. Yet today we read in the Scripture that Jesus was questioned by Pilate about His kingship, later, condemned on the cross (not a cozy throne), given a crown of thorns (not of gold), mocked and spiting on him questioning: "are you not Christ? Save yourself and us!" (no praising and singing 'Hails'). Still we celebrate today and say: "**Jesus Christ is the King.**" How does Jesus Christ become the King of the universe? Jesus Christ reveals that his kingdom is of truth – "everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice" (Jn. 18: 37). The book of Revelation proclaims that 'to Jesus Christ belongs all glory and power as Jesus loved us and has freed us from our sins by his blood' (Rev. 1:6). It is Saint Paul who writes the beautiful Poem of Glory of Jesus Christ as King praising: Jesus is King because by dying he saved us from our Last enemy, death... **brought about redemption, forgiveness of sins ...and making peace through the blood of his Cross.** (Colossians 1: 12 – 20).

Today we are left with those prayerful words of the sinner who was dying with Jesus on the Cross prayed: "**Jesus, Remember me when you come into your Kingdom**". Then Jesus, before his death, makes the Royal Promise while hanging on the cross: "**Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise.**" So we honor Jesus Christ as King and Lord of the Universe, for winning us the Paradise for each one of us.


