Reflections from Letter of Pope Francis: Laudato Si

We are made to believe that we can use the earth's resources for the good of humanity and the economy; not mentioning the sustaining importance of the cycle of life, giving to the interconnectedness of everything.

Caring for the Earth is caring for the poor and vulnerable, "the human environment and the natural environment deteriorate together; we cannot adequately combat environmental degradation unless we attend to causes related to human and social degradation. In fact, the deterioration of the environment and of society affects the most vulnerable people on the planet: 'Both everyday experience and scientific research show that the gravest effects of all attacks on the environment are suffered by the poorest'." (Laudato Si' #48) Utmost care for the migrants and refugees, for the indigenous communities, and for all those affected by tragedies and disasters is of paramount importance.

- Caring for the Earth is embracing the interconnectedness of everything. (Laudato Si#16) •
- "Our relationship with the environment can never be isolated from our relationship with others and with God." (Laudato Si' #119)
- "Because all creatures are connected, each must be cherished with love and respect for all of us as living creatures are dependent on one another." (Laudato Si' #42)

Caring for the Earth is praxis-oriented. How? We can try the green actions proposed by Pope Francis (Laudato Si' #211):

- 1. avoiding the use of plastic and paper
- 2. reducing water consumption
- 3. separating refuse
- 4. cooking only what can reasonably be consumed
- 5. showing care for other living beings
- 6. using public transport or car-pooling
- 7. planting trees
- 8. turning off unnecessary lights
- 9. reusing something instead of immediately discarding it

Caring for the Earth sustains and strengthens our ecological faith, in the lights and shadows of our climate action "may our struggles and our concern for this planet never take away the joy of our hope. God does not abandon us, God does not leave us alone. Caring for the Earth leads us to contemplation, "all creatures are moving forward with us and through us towards a common point of arrival, which is God, in that transcendent fullness where the risen Christ embraces and illumines all things. Human beings, endowed with intelligence and love, and drawn by the fullness of Christ, are called to lead all creatures back to their Creator." (Laudato Si #83)

World Day of Prayer for Creation

All-powerful God, you are present in the whole universe and in the smallest of your creatures. You embrace with your tenderness all that exists. Pour out upon us the power of your love, that we may protect life and beauty.

Fill us with peace that we may live as brothers and sisters, harming no one.

Bring healing to our lives, that we may protect the world and not prey on it, that we may sow beauty, not pollution and destruction. Touch the hearts of those who look only for gain at the expense of the poor and the earth.
