

**Marriages:** Marriages are celebrated in the Church where the bride or groom is registered at. When a man and a woman plan to marry each other, they should contact a priest one year in advance and always before the wedding date is set, and before arranging for the reception hall. The engaged are required to attend a Marriage Preparation Course.

**Please note:** However, if this man or woman has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted. Questions are often being asked about marriages performed outside the Catholic Church by non-Catholic ministers. These are not valid marriages according to the teaching of the Catholic Church, but many can be rectified by simply consulting with your Parish priest to discuss the available options. Sometimes people make decisions without proper information, so if you wish, please contact your Pastor for details or call the Marriage Tribunal at 416-934-3400 ext 300.

## **INVALID MARRIAGES**

Whenever a marriage takes place in which one or both parties are Catholic, the Catholic party is bound by the required "form" for marriage. This "form" means that whenever a Catholic person is married, they are required to be married before a priest and two witnesses. This is a precept of the Church and all Catholics have a serious obligation to observe the required form. This is an essential part of being a Catholic Christian. Civil unions are contracts of marriage but are not recognized by the faith community as covenants or sacramental unions. Please contact Father if this is a situation you find yourself in and Father will be very happy to assist you.

#### HANDLING DIFFICULT RELATIONSHIPS

All challenges that face us eventually come down to tests to see if we handle those challenges with love, faith, and charity. It does not mean that we sweep evil under the rug; love is often firm love. But we must have love as the force behind us and our families.

We all have "toxic" relationships. There are certain people, including relatives, who may simply rub you the wrong way. Make sure first that it isn't you! Some have been placed to test our love while in other cases there is evil or emotional illness and it causes a reaction – one that you must try to purge from your family. The expression of how a rotten apple can spoil the bunch is especially true with our loved ones: a single difficult person under the influence of the devil or an unclean discarnate spirit can cause mayhem – and channel ancestral darkness like that hose that squirts acidity across the family.

"If there is one thing that characterizes my ministry, it is the message of forgiveness," noted the charismatic author, Father Robert DeGrandis. "Wherever I go, I tell the people to forgive, forgive, and keep on forgiving. Forgiveness is the pathway to healing. Forgiveness is loving. It is letting go of hardness toward a person; releasing those things 'held against' a person; releasing a person from bondage. Forgiveness is a lifelong process and a moment-by-moment grace. I have discovered that when we simply allow the Lord to empower our choice to forgive, the transformation process begins. Forgiveness dissolves the connection with the unlove of the past. The age-old emotions that were 'buried alive' are laid to rest. In visualization we see the deceased taken to the forgiving Presence of the Lord in the Eucharist. The forgiveness process is multi-directional. First, in the Presence of Jesus, we ask the deceased to forgive us for any wrongs we may have committed. Perhaps that might include the failure to pray for family members who needed prayer. Second, we forgive them for their sinful habits and for the damage they have done. One might say, 'I forgive you for what you did that is affecting me today.' Finally, we need to apologize to God for the sins of our ancestors."

Every family and ancestry - save for Jesus, Mary, and Joseph — has tendencies that were or are negative and need to be purged. It could be a family inclination to selfishness, division, pride, or argumentation. It could be occultism. It could be a preoccupation with materialism. It could be lying. These characteristics need to be cast out as "spirits" - blotches of darkness — or they will repeat themselves like a broken record in our lives and then in the lives of those who come after us. "Loving families lay the foundation for our eternal progress," writes another who had a near-death episode. "They help us build strengths, identify and overcome weaknesses, and bring challenges of their own for us to overcome. They significantly influence us in our earthly missions and affect how we influence others in their missions. Every family bond - with spouse, children, parents, grandparents, grandchildren, in-laws, uncles, cousins, etcetera - can play a crucial role in teaching us how to love and be loved." - Spirit Daily

#### APPARENT MIRACLE IN THOMASTON REFERRED TO CATHOLIC EXPERTS IN ROME

The Dicastery for the Doctrine of Faith in Rome will determine whether the alleged multiplication of wafers during a mass service in Thomaston was indeed a miracle.

The apparent miracle that was reported out of a Thomaston church back in March is being referred to Faith experts in Europe. The Dicastery for the Doctrine of Faith in Rome will determine whether the alleged multiplication of wafers during a mass service in Thomaston was indeed a miracle. The Archdiocese of Hartford told FOX61 that it awaits the Doctrine of Faith's response. Shortly before Easter, the alleged miracle took place during a Sunday Lenten Mass.

St. Thomas pastor Father Joseph Crowley addressed his congregation just minutes after the apparent miracle took place. "What happened is our Lord multiplied himself," said Crowley.FOX61 was the only TV station allowed inside St. Thomas Church just days after Eucharistic wafers, which Catholics believe transform themselves into the body of Christ, reportedly multiplied in a blessed serving vessel called a ciborium during communion. "A very cool miracle. There's no doubt. I have no doubt," remarked Crowley during a subsequent service. Crowley said the Eucharistic minister observed that there were not enough hosts for all people in line to get one. He was about to go get more when the hosts reportedly multiplied several times over. Just feel it in your heart," said Jean Beck. "How can you look at everything that's going on and not believe?" Beck said it's a moment she will carry with her for the rest of her life. She had lost her mother just two days before. "It was such a glorious, joyful, wonderful thing that it brought peace to my heart because she was a parishioner all her life here," Beck said. "It surprises me. I hope it's real. If it isn't at least it will bring somebody back to faith and we know that these things can happen," remarked parishioner Michael Conway. Speaking exclusively to FOX61 back in March, Archbishop Leonard Blair said the church's investigation might involve a scientific or forensic analysis of the communion hosts. "I'm sending out an experienced Priest who has a knowledge of church or Canon law," explained Archbishop Blair. "They will follow a procedure to examine what happened, under what circumstances and by whom."

Blair told said the outcome of that investigation would determine if he needed to notify the Vatican. "The guidelines for these kinds of situations do call for me to notify the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith in Rome," said Blair. Throughout the entire 21st century, there have only been four Eucharistic miracles recognized by the Catholic Church. The most recent was in 2013 in Poland, where a host that fell on the floor was put into water to dissolve. It became streaked with red stains that were tested and found to contain fragments of the heart muscle. St. Thomas Church is the church where Rev. Michael McGivney once served. McGivney has one previous miracle attributed to him. He was beatified in 2020 and given the title "Blessed". If a second miracle is attributed to him, it could set him on a path to being canonized as a saint. In order for a miracle to be attributed to McGivney, there would have to be evidence that someone prayed specifically in his name. – fox 61.com
