Father Cosmas' Reflection

Sharing our Stories with Christ

One of the most interesting stories in the Gospel is that of the encounter between the risen Saviour and the disciples on the road to Emmaus. In this story Jesus after listening to the stories of the disciples revealed himself in the breaking of bread.

Jesus helped the two disciples to share their story so that it mingled with his. He drew it out of them, and illuminated it with his own story.

The risen Saviour who speaks to us in the scriptures and nourishes us in the Eucharist is still with us in the journey of our lives even though we may not recognize him. He is so close to us that our stories merge with his. It is only his story that makes sense of ours. Jesus also shows us how to listen to other people's stories. It simply means walking with them, being present to them to accompany them, and listening to them. To do these is to do good work today.
