First Reading: Leviticus 19:1-2, 17-18

Goodness is possible for everyone. No one has permission to sin.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 3:16-23

Paul writes to the Corinthians, a community made up of common people with no pretension of greatness. He reminds them that their dignity comes from being temples of God.

Gospel: Matthew 5:38-48

Jesus sets out the implications of living as his disciples. He reminds us that God gives the same grace to good and bad people alike. The choice is ours, on a daily basis, whether to respond to it or not.

Father Cosmas' Reflection

Love your Enemies

This is perhaps one of the most difficult injunctions that we can find in the scriptures. Returning love for hate is one of the most challenging things to do. It is a very high ideal. However, as Christians we are called to imitate the generosity of God in our willingness and readiness to forgive and to embrace non-violence. Opting for non-violence is believing more strongly in the power of love over hate.

When Jesus talks about 'the enemy' he is not necessarily referring to those who take up arms against us in war. This 'enemy' might be someone very close to us. Ironically, while on vacation in my home country Nigeria this past January, I heard a new word or slang that has become a common parlance. The word is 'frenemy.' It refers to someone who is supposedly a friend but he or she is indeed an enemy within. In the same way Jesus' reference to 'enemy' may include someone in my family, my parish, my community, my work-place or my neighbourhood. People who make life difficult for us and people we find it hard to forgive, they all make the list of 'enemies.' These are the people Jesus asks us to love. In asking us to love them, Jesus is indeed reminding us that the greatest gift we posses is the gift of love. The only thing that can destroy this beautiful gift is hatred. Hate poisons the heart; love purifies it.
