Third Sunday of Lent

"Anyone who drinks the water that I shall give will never be thirsty again."

Introduction

Today's readings focus on living water as a symbol of God's healing love and desire to save. They also remind us of the deep thirst within every human soul that can lead to deep relationship with Good or to desert dryness and emptiness. The choice is ours.

Today's Readings

First Reading: Exodus 17:3-7

The book of Exodus tells the story of God's unfailing desire to be in relationship with us. However unfaithful we may be, however many false idols we may turn to in our search for security, God will never fail us and always holds to the covenant promises.

Second Reading: Romans 5:1-2, 5-8

Paul writes to the Romans, reminding them that through God's grace they have a reliable hope that cannot be disappointed. This is not cheap and easy grace, but the power, through Christ, to live differently and to trust in his promises.

Gospel: John 4:5-42

The story of the woman of Samaria is rich with resonance. Jesus comes to meet this woman where she is. He listens to her questions and her struggles with faith, trust and hope. He invites her to change her perception of God and by doing so changes her experience of herself.

Father Cosmas' Reflection

We are loved in our sins

It is very comforting to know that we are loved in our sins. In today's Gospel we read about the moving encounter between Jesus and the Samaritan woman. Jesus approach to this outcast woman was ever so gentle. He treated her with great respect. Not a hint of judgement or condemnation. At the end she felt accepted and understood. In the same way Christ meets us where we are without judging or condemning us. Jesus is not fazed by our sins. The woman perceived Jesus as a prophet because He gently called out her sin and "told me everything I ever did" (John 4:29). Jesus is sovereign and sees the sin within our hearts (1Timothy 5:15). He knows our desires, and yet He still pursues us and loves us (Romans 3:23) He is not surprised by our evil desires, but rather He seeks to reconcile us to the Father in spite of them. Christ knows our deeper thirst- the thirst of the heart, which ultimately only God can quench. The water that Jesus gives to quench this thirst is the life of God bubbling up inside us.
