


MISSION STATEMENT

Father Cosmas' Reflection

Pray in season and out of season

The Readings of this Sunday urge us to pray without ceasing. To pray to God is to put our faith in him. Prayer and faith are very closely connected. No one can completely live a Christian life without prayer. When we pray only in emergency situation, then we are not following the command of Christ who asks us to pray continually and never lose heart (Luke 18:1). Praying continuously helps us to see the value of prayer. It also strengthens and deepens our relationship with the Lord. In fact, the main purpose of prayer is to foster this relationship with God. The reasons some people lose heart and not praying continually is either they do not put their trust in God or they feel that their prayers are not being answered. A prayer is answered, not when we get what we are asking for, but when we are granted a sense of God's nearness. Prayer may not change the world for us but it can give us the courage to face it. To pray is to put oneself and one's destiny in the hands of God and when my whole being and my destiny are in God's hand, then I am safe. So, do you pray continually?


