Father Cosmas' Reflection

Leading a New Life

Zacchaeus was a tax collector and, as such, was hated by the people, because the tax collectors were collaborators of the Roman authorities and were often guilty of abuses.

Today's Gospel therefore implies that Zacchaeus had things to seek forgiveness for. Certainly he was very keen to see Jesus and he did everything he could to do so. Jesus rewards his efforts by staying as a guest in his house. Moved by our Lord's presence Zacchaeus begins to lead a new life.

Like Zacchaeus, we can become lost and aware that we have made worldliness a priority. The key to our salvation is how we respond to this realization. Permanent salvation requires prayer, processing regret, and restitution. We must also actively seek forgiveness, enter an examination of self and love God and neighbor. All of us stand in need of such a conversion. Each of us has the capacity that Zacchaeus had, though it may be hidden or unexpressed. If we do what it takes, we can lead a new life filled with grace and mercy.
