
MISSION STATEMENT

Father Cosmas' Reflection

Healing of Family Wounds

The parable of the prodigal son is one of the best stories told by Jesus in the Gospel. The themes of forgiveness and mercy are usually common when reflecting on this parable. However, there is also the perspective of healing of family wounds. Many of us are not strangers to family conflicts and wounds. The question is what do we do with such conflicts when they arise and how do we heal such wounds. There is a well-known saving 'You can choose your friends but you can't choose your family'. This is a universal truth which points to the fact that we are all 'stuck' with our families. With family we have no choice, it is fated. Yet family ties sometimes can be the most painful of all. Often we find ourselves caught in the web of painful emotional situations with siblings, parents or children that feels difficult to resolve. This was exactly the case with the family of the prodigal son that needed healing of family wounds. Beyond the lessons of forgiveness and mercy on the part of the father or even resentment on the part of the older brother, there is also the gratifying experience of healing of family wounds that occurred. The end goal for embarking on this journey of healing is to be at peace with family members. Unfortunately, healing of family wounds may not always result in being in harmony with our family the rest of our lives. It may still mean we remain estranged with someone in the family. The important thing is to work on our part of it, what we may have hoped to learn from this painful situation, take back our projections, and find a place of inner peace with it. If we can truly grasp and understand this, then I feel we are on the way to true healing. The positive impact of doing this will then affect the power line that connects us all to the highest good-God.


