
#### **MISSION STATEMENT**

# The Cost of Discipleship

The demand to hate father, mother, wife, children, brothers and sisters and even ones own life as a condition for following Christ sounds unrealistic and very costly. In fact, it does not sound Christlike given that he was the one that asks us to love everyone including our family members. However, it is important to note that this radical call by Christ was only made using a figure of speech (hyperbole) that exaggerates for emphasis. Our Lord is simply reminding us that our love for him and for God should be so strong and so committed that our affection for our families and our own lives in comparison would appear to be like hatred. Jesus is not teaching us to hate our loved ones, others and our own life. He was in fact laying the foundation for the establishment of clear priorities for his disciples. Simply put, a disciple of Christ is to have an unqualified loyalty and love for God nothing can take this place in their hearts if they seek to be genuine disciples.


