Many parishes in our Diocese make available to parishioners the option of contributing to the parish using pre-authorized debiting. Parishioners who wish to support the parish in this way do not have to worry about using envelopes because donations are automatically debited from your account. It is a very efficient system and operates very smoothly, with a minimum of effort.

There is some flexibility. Parishioners indicate on the form how much they would like to donate and also which date they would like to contribute (the 1st or 15th of the month). Donations can be made to the regular Sunday collection and or to Diocesan Collections using this method. Amounts can be topped up on request and the service can be changed or altered within one or two business days.
