My cousins are twins. They are fraternal twins, not identical ones, so they never got to pull any of the cool "twin" stuff when they were growing up. They didn't get to confuse teachers by exchanging classes nor did they have the chance to mix up girlfriends or boyfriends by switching up on a date. As a matter of fact, since my cousins are Paul and Karen there wasn't much about them that was very twin-like except for the fact that they had the same birthday. Even though the family was close, as they grew up they chose different paths in life, going to universities in different states and even moving in opposite directions after graduating. Occasionally, they would talk about a "special" connection, but for the most part they lived their lives as any brother and sister.

In today's Gospel, it is mentioned that Thomas is a twin. We don't know any more than that. We don't know if the other twin is a brother or sister. We don't even know if the other is still alive. The mention of Thomas being a twin is just one of those fascinating little fragments that pops up from time to time in the Scriptures that leaves a person wondering, "What is the rest of the story?"

The "rest of the story" in this case is that physical knowledge of Jesus is just not that important. Just like it is unimportant whether Thomas' twin is there, so too it is not essential to have the physical body of Jesus standing in front of us to "prove" that he lives. We do not have to see Jesus to believe in him. As a matter of fact, believing in Jesus is seeing him not in his physical form, but in the community of believers who act as him in the world today. In effect, people should see him in us, because we act as his identical twin

If we do, we could be shut down completely by the Winnipeg Police or Fire Service should they arrive to inspect our numbers. The sad part of this story is that those who wanted to join us in the liturgies once we were full could not come in. All of us here are hurt and feel very badly about this and this includes the Archbishop, the staff of the Cathedral, myself-everyone of us! I apologize to all those who were not allowed access after we were full according to the official numbers permitted by civil law. It hurts me that we were not able to accommodate you who wanted to join us. I pray we may be able to change this in the future. In the meanwhile, thank you for loving the Cathedral so much you wanted to join us. God bless you in His everlasting love!
