

## **Easter Sunday of the Resurrection** of the Lord

A lot of school districts in the country no longer have Easter vacation. Instead, they have spring break. As Christians,

we may mourn the passing of public holidays tied to our religious festivals, but in some ways that may serve to bring us back to the very roots of our faith. The weekend as we know it today is a modern

invention, brought about by the movement for a forty-hour work week. The first Christians, like much of the ancient world, worked every day. There was no break, except for occasional festivals. Our ancestors in the faith would arise early on the first day of the week, often before sunrise, so that they could celebrate the day of the Lord. Holding the vigil in the night of Easter or celebrating with a sunrise service is actually hearkening back to the origins of our faith.

The Gospel today tells us the experience of the first Easter. Whether we hear the story from Mark ("Very early when the sun had risen, on the first day of the week...") or from John ("On the first day of the week...early in the morning, while it was still dark...") it is clear that those who went to the tomb found it empty. Jesus had risen from the dead. Everything had changed.

The first Christians continued to live their lives in the culture they inhabited. But because their lives were transformed, the culture began to change as well. They cared for the sick. They helped widows and orphans. They took up collections for the poor. They rejected the pagan gods and the deification of secular power as embodied in the emperor. They formed communities that gathered on the first day of the week no matter what obstacles lay in their path, even if that meant the possibility of death. They did all of this, because they believed in the Lord of life, who is forever risen from the dead. Alleluia!
