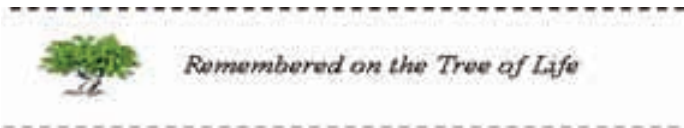

17th Sunday in Ordinary Time




Big cities can have a special attraction. The commercial areas can be alive with such hustle and bustle. Walking past store windows and sidewalk restaurants can enliven one's spirit as the great mass of humanity seems to be undulating with all the excitement of commerce and exchange. In large cities one can often hear multiple languages just by walking a few blocks as people from different parts of the world mix together on the sidewalks of America. Walk a few blocks in any big city and it is likely that you will come upon someone begging or panhandling on the street. In some places the beggars are very discreet, just sitting on a bench or a sidewalk with a paper cup in their hand that may have a few coins in it so as not to attract the attention of the police. In other places, the begging may be more aggressive with requests hurled at passersby. In a big city, every beggar has his regulars who give him something when they see him. But there are also the hundreds who will pass by. And then there are the occasional visitors who are unsure whether to heed the beggars' pleas or not.

In the Gospel this weekend, the disciples of Jesus ask him to teach them how to pray. He then goes on to describe for them the nature of prayer. He reminds the disciples not to give up. They must be persistent in their prayer, asking for what is needed.

Most of us probably can't ever conceive of ourselves as beggars sitting on the street corner of some large city, even though it is likely that at some point in our lives we have seen them (and maybe even given them something!). But that is exactly what we are every time we pray the Lord's Prayer. After all, we pray, "Give us this day our daily bread." You can't be much more of a beggar than that!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

It is a joy to be appointed as your new Rector. So that you may become more familiar with who I am, let me take this opportunity to introduce myself.

I am a Canadian-born Filipino, the eldest of two sons. My parents Rudy and Perlie, immigrated to Winnipeg in the early 1970s where they met each other and were married here at St. Mary's Cathedral. I have a younger brother Ian, and have most recently gained a wonderful sister-in-law, Sabrina.

After five years of formation at St. Joseph Seminary (Edmonton, AB) and one year of internship at Good Shepherd Parish (Portage La Prairie) I was ordained to the ministerial priesthood on May 30th, 2008. I began my first appointment as Parochial Vicar at St. John Cantius Parish for two years, after which I ventured towards rural Manitoba to begin my first Pastorate in the Westman Deanery, serving the communities of Sacred Heart Parish (Virden), and Paroisse St. Jean (Grande Clairière).

Some of you may remember when I was hired at St. Mary's Cathedral in 1999 as organist/pianist, and later as choir director. Since then, I have continued my involvement in liturgical music, both within the Archdiocese, such as directing the Archdiocesan Choir, and beyond. In November of 2007, I was commissioned by the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops to compose a National Mass setting for the new translation of the Roman Missal. In May of 2009 I was appointed by the CCCB to sit on the National Council for Liturgical Music where I continue to represent Western Canada. I have facilitated workshops throughout most of Western Canada and Ontario and I offer a quarterly publication of liturgical music selections in the "Prairie Messenger" in partnership with Bernadette Gasslein. I am a summer graduate student at the University of Notre Dame (Indiana) where I am currently completing a Masters degree in Liturgical Theology.

As I begin this exciting new appointment, I want to thank you for your faith and commitment to the parish community. I pray, that we may grow together in God's loving way, so that God's reign may truly be known in all aspects of our lives.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

The RCIA program is a process designed for people who wish to become members of the Catholic Church. Candidates may be individuals who have not been baptized, or were baptized in another Christian church.

The RCIA program begins in each year in September and continues until the Rites of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist) are received at the Easter Vigil, the Saturday evening Mass held before Easter Sunday. Weekly meetings are usually held on Sunday.
