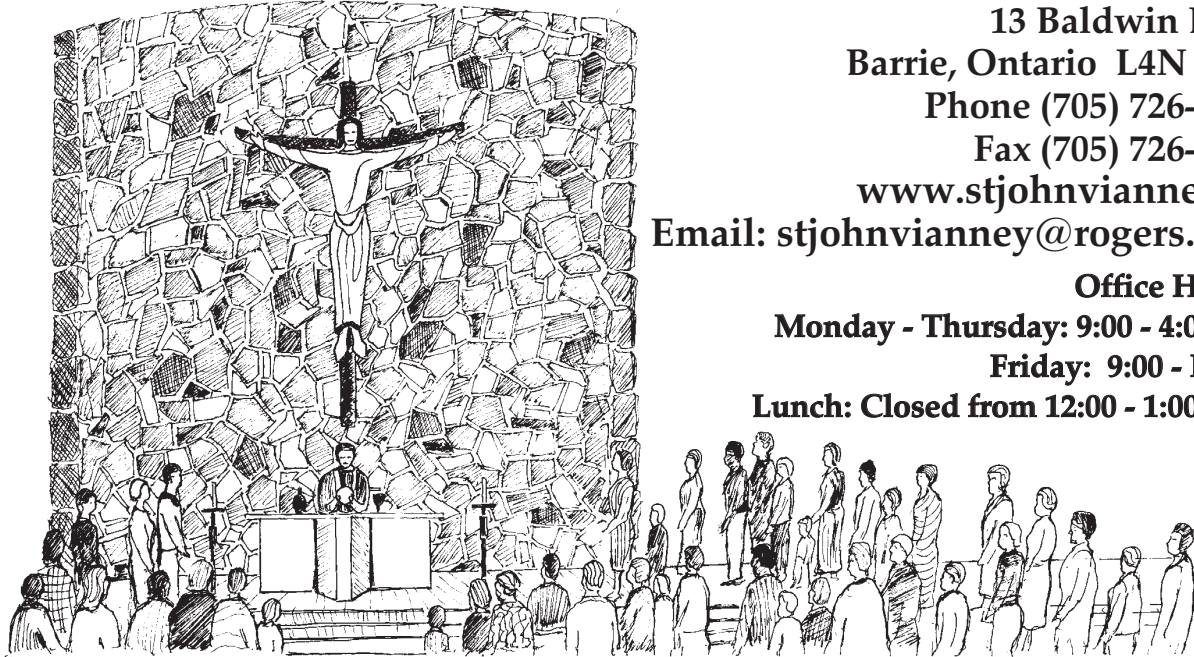

RECONCILIATION

Little Johnny had a quarrel with his younger brother. Before he said his night prayers, Johnny’s mother said to him, “Now I want you to forgive your brother.” But Johnny was not in a forgiving mood. “No, I won’t forgive him,” he said. Mother tried persuasions of every motherly variety, but nothing worked. Finally, she said, “What if your brother were to die tonight? How would you feel if you knew you hadn’t forgiven him? Then Johnny said, “All right, I forgive him, but if he’s alive in the morning, I’ll get even with him.”

St. Augustine of Hippo stated in his book “Our Lord’s Sermon on the Mount” that “if anyone, will piously and soberly consider the sermon which our Lord Jesus Christ spoke on the mount, I think that he will find it, so far as regards the highest morals, a perfect standard of the Christian Life”

One of those standards highlighted in today’s Gospel is reconciliation. Jesus, through

specific examples, shares with His disciples the negative impact of unresolved and conflictive human interactions, offering at the same time a mechanism for accountability and a path towards mending broken relationships.

For real reconciliation to occur, we must not only meditate and identify the offense, but also value the relationship that may be jeopardized by such offense. It requires openness of heart to engage in dialogue and to seek the restoration of that particular relationship. God desires for us to live in relationship with one another. When our relationships are broken, other areas of our lives may become off-balance to the extent that, at times, it may impact our ability to function.

Broken relationships separate us from one another and, in some ways, from God. At times, we are oblivious to the impact of our actions in the life of others. Our intent may be genuine or without malice, and the impact in others may be devastating. Pride may also play a significant role, impeding us from reconciling with those whom we love and love us, and from those who differ from us. As Christians, we are called to love our neighbors as ourselves. We are called to build bridges, not walls.

Today’s gospel invites us to reconcile with our brothers and sisters first before we come to God. We cannot be right with God until we are right with one another. It is easier to offer sacrifice to God and ask for His forgiveness. We first have to do our best to put things right with our brothers and sisters before we could be right with God.

There was a tribe in Kenya; every time a priest visited them he brought a basket full of green grass, which is a sign of life. This basket passes from one family to another but if the family is not living in peace, they are not allowed to pass this basket of grass. The priest waits for a week and if the basket does not return to him, he knows the tribal peace is disturbed and people are not in condition to celebrate mass and receive communion. If we pass a basket full of green grass in our parish community, will there be a Mass in our church next Sunday?

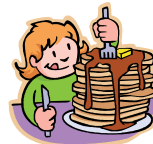
EDGE CAMP
