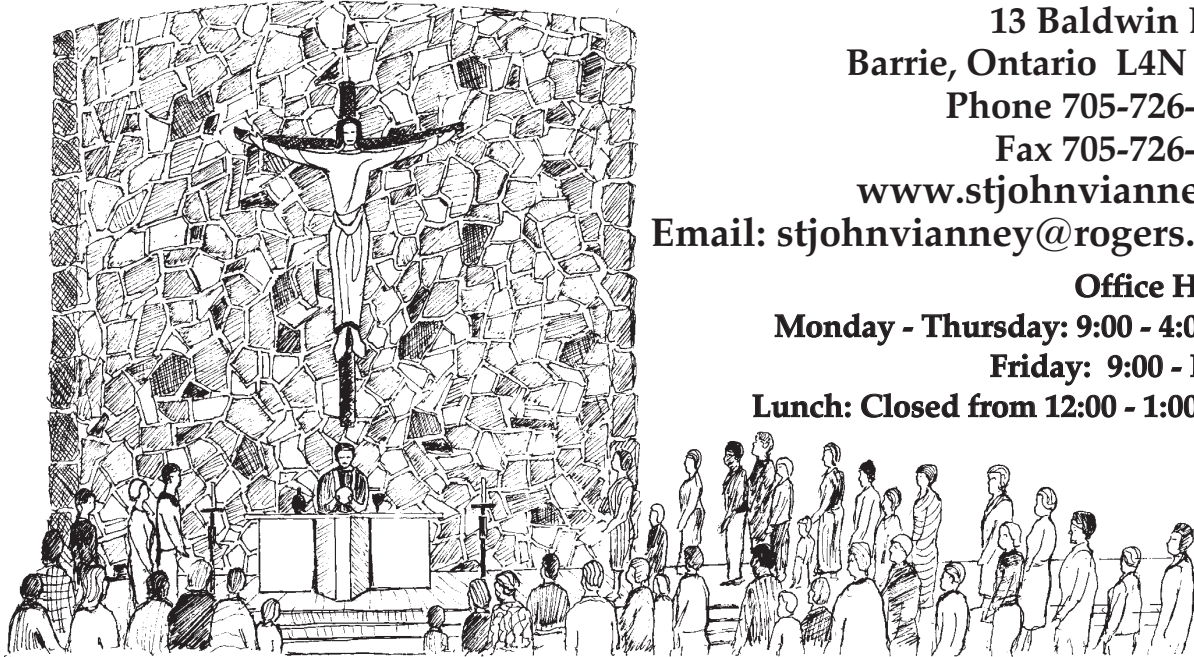

BEING CHURCH

Pentecost is often called the birthday of the church. As a direct result of the words and works, the passion, death, resurrection and ascension of Jesus, the gift of the Spirit was unleashed upon the world. Those who knew themselves to be the recipients of that gift became newly identified as church. By the power of that same Spirit, those so identified began to understand what it meant to be church in the world.

They learned that being church meant to challenge the world as Jesus had done. Being church meant bringing the good news of God's love and forgiveness to all. Being church meant discovering within oneself faith where once there was fear, conviction where once there was doubt, grace where once there was weakness, hope where once there was discouragement, and love for others where once there was prejudice and hate. Being church meant praying together, learning together, working together and sticking together despite differences of race, background, gender, socio-economic status and political leanings.

Being church meant gathering for the breaking of the Bread, both of the Word and the Eucharist. Being church also meant the revolution of all things and the re-examination of all values; it meant being willing to experience the complete changing of all conditions and all possibilities, the switching of all relationships in business, family, society and everywhere. Being church meant being willing to die rather than forfeit faith. Being church meant living in the

awareness of the risen Christ and offering the joy of that same awareness to others.

Being church meant belonging to a life-sharing community wherein no one suffered for lack of food, clothing, shelter, companionship or any of the other necessities of life. Being church meant being a people who no longer thought solely in terms of me and mine, but of we and us and ours. Being church meant leaving the security of home and family in order to bring the good news to others, regardless of the distance, danger or inconvenience. Being church meant living and caring and sharing in such a manner that others were drawn to desire a similar belonging.

The Pentecostal spring of the early Christian church stands in sharp contrast to the Christianity of later centuries. The contemporary church has lost something of the fire and faith and unconditional love of its ancestral forbears. Somewhere in the morass of institutionalization the Spirit of the early church began to breathe shallower.

It's time for a new Pentecost. We, the church should examine ourselves, recover its initial rootedness in Christ, and be revived in the Spirit so as to become once again the servant of the world's poor, hungry, homeless, victimized and marginalized. For ours is a community of persons united in Christ and guided by the Holy Spirit who are meant to be the bearers of a message of salvation intended for all of humankind. The solemnity of Pentecost challenges us to continue what began with Peter and company and what was continued by Paul and the many members of the one body of Christ.
