
# Holy Week Donations received to date during COVID Mass suspension including online donations

#### 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Easter (Divine Mercy Sunday)

Introduction To Penitential Rite: Today Thomas is invited to place his finger in the nail prints and his hand into the open side of the risen Christ. The crucified and risen Christ invites us to receive him at every Mass. We ask forgiveness for failing to appreciate this great gift.

Acts 2:42-47 In the first reading, the church responds to the gift of the Holy Spirit. The disciples become models of devotion to God and love of neighbor.

**1 Peter 1:3-9** In the second reading, Peter praises God for his great mercy in bringing Christians to a living hope for eternal salvation. This hope is based on Jesus' resurrection.

John 20:19-31 In the Gospel, Jesus appears to his disciples and later to Thomas. He calms their fear with the gifts of his peace and the Holy Spirit, thus commissioning them to carry on his work.
