From the Pastor's desk:

<u>Building Community – 95th Anniversary Pictorial</u> Directory

It's that time where we will prepare for our 95th Anniversary in 2020. We will start booking appointments for parishioners to have their family photo's taken for our Pictorial Directory. These books serve our parishioners in many ways: connects names with faces, lasting keepsake, valuable communications reference for members, builds and strengthens our faith community! We will have two sign up weekends before we start phoning parishioners, these weekends are January 26/27 and February 2/3. Our first photo session date is Wednesday February 13th. Please sign up on one of those weekends or say "Yes!" when one of our parish volunteers phone you. In just one appointment, you will have your photo taken and you will get to pick which photo you would like published in the book.

There is no cost to you or the parish, there is no obligation to purchase photo's, and every family who has a photo taken will be getting a free directory!

Collection/Currency from other countries

Quite often we find coins and bills from other countries in the parish weekend collection. Please do not place coins or small bills from other countries into the collection. The coins (usually from the Philippines) I simply give to someone whom I know is going to the Philippines. The small bills (so far there have been no larger bills) I try and return to the person who gave it or, like the coins, I simply give them to someone who is going to the Philippines. In any case, money from other countries just causes additional work for the counters and myself and does not, in any way, benefit the parish. The only exception is U.S. money which is, at present, higher in value than Canadian money. Feel free to place U.S. money in the collection.

Men, take off your hats in church

I have noticed more and more often that some men are in church with their hats on their heads. This could be a "sign of our times" in terms of men wearing hats in other places like their homes, school, university, etc. There was a time when no man would wear his hat in the house, let alone in a public building. However, it continues to be disrespectful for a man to have his head covered in a sacred place of worship. St. Paul tells us in his First Letter to the Corinthians 11:4 "Every man who prays or prophesies with his head covered dishonours his head, who is God." Since those men who wear their hats in church are probably men who do not usually attend church, it is up to you parents, grandparents, relatives, friends, to inform them of this tradition. Women, however, are still allowed to have their heads covered in church.

Jesus The Liberator

Herein lies the heart of our gospel today. In Jesus' words, "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free..."

This is the Spirit that energizes each one of us. Whether we are a health professional, a teacher, a parent, an aunt or uncle... or a good friend, it starts with our feeling the Spirit's desire in our heart to "proclaim liberty" to the captive people around us.

When we see suffering, we feel compassion—whether it's a child, neighbor, or friend. Like Jesus, we genuinely want to help the blind recover sight and the oppressed go free. That is the Holy Spirit's effect upon us.But then often we feel overwhelmed by the size of the task. In trying to be "all things to all people," in doing our best to help our mothers, grandmothers, husbands, students, we face burnout at alarming rates these days. Then we feel guilty for letting up, even a little.

Did you notice that in our reading today? Once the people knew the law, and came to their senses about just how much suffering there was, the prophet said, "Don't fall apart grieving. You don't have to wipe out all evil single-handedly—the Lord MUST be your strength, so start rejoicing!"

St. Paul gives us the blueprint for how to rejoice always. We are to realize that it takes the whole body to do God's work. Don't see yourself as just one person—which leads to arrogance, pride, and separation from others. But see yourself as a working member of the body. And see whatever small or large talents you can bring to the body as part of the healing of our whole Body of Christ.

Our next executive meeting will be on Tuesday January 29th at 7:30pm and our next general meeting will be on Thursday February 7th. All CWL


members are invited to attend mass at 7pm as we will have installation of officers of the new executive following mass.
