# From the Pastor's desk:

#### Sanctuary Renovation

The ecclesiastical artist Jozef Reibesteijn was here this week on his way to work on a new church being built in Canmore, Alberta. He and Dennis Flores were working on the final touch for the wall behind the tabernacle, namely the words "Sanctus, Sanctus, Sanctus" which will be placed above the arch over the tabernacle. The floor tile installer, Vittorio Loconte was also here this week. He will begin the installation of the tiles in the main body of the church in July. It will take him three or four weeks to install and place the pews back in place. During that time we will have to offer the weekend Masses in the basement hall. This will necessitate some volunteers to help set up and take down the chairs because of the Wednesday evening bingo. We will also need some volunteers to help stack the pews. During the month of July, with the noise of the installation of the tiles, etc. we will not have adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. I hope that we will still be able to have the weekday Masses in the gathering area, but we will have to determine that when the time arrives. I do not want to impede the installation of the tiles or "get in the way" of the work being done in the church. I did not schedule any weddings or baptisms during the month of July. Also, no one is allowed to die during the floor installation!!!

#### Pastoral Financial Report for 2017

Due to reasons beyond my control I am only now making the financial report for last year 2017 available to any parishioner who may be interested in receiving a copy. #### Cantors Needed

We have some excellent cantors who sing the psalms and lead us in congregational singing at all three Masses, however we need more. Those who lead the singing cannot always be here. We need others to use their time and talent in this valuable ministry. If God has given you a good singing voice, then please come forward and volunteer your talent. In a parish the size of St. Anthony's there have to be more great voices out there. If a son or daughter of yours has a great voice and they are too shy to tell me, then you, as their parent tell me. Perhaps we can work together to encourage your son or daughter to sing at Mass.

#### Daughters of Mercy

The daughters of mercy are a group of women who consecrate themselves to the Lord Jesus. Their mission is to prav for the priests and the Archbishop, as well as to intercede for more vocations to the priesthood. Their daily duties of prayer and sacrifice include: prayer for priests written by St. Theresa of Lisieux, a Holy Hour in front of the Blessed Sacrament, Holy Communion at least once a week, rosary, Divine Mercy Chaplet, Angelus, Memorare, Divine Office at least once a day, examination of conscience, frequent confession, and once a month the daughters of mercy get together as a group to pray one of the daily offices and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament for vocations to the priesthood here in the Archdiocese of Winnipeg. Father Peter Nemcek is their chaplain. There is no financial cost. Should you be interested in becoming a Daughter of Mercy please speak with Fr. Dominic who will give you the particulars.

#### Stewardship Bulletin Reflection Sunday June 10th – Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

In our journey as disciples and stewards, St. Paul encourages us to "not lose heart". Maturing in our faith can be challenging at times. Paul reminds us that our outer self and all its desires are wasting away. However, the good news, Paul tells us, is that day by day we are renewing our inner self (knowing God's will and deepening our commitment to Christ). We do this by cooperating with God's grace. We also do this by the stewardship we exercise over our gifts, and not just our time, talent and treasure. Stewardship is not separate from the Christian life. We must not confine stewardship to a box labeled 'time, talent and treasure'. Taking it out of the box into our day to day living is where we find joy.

How we steward the gifts of our relationships; the environment; our jobs; our neighbors; our children; our health; just to name a few examples, is all a reflection of our commitment to Christ. Day to day stewardship has a profound impact in how we experience every aspect of our lives. One of the joys of stewardship is found in the ability to appreciate the goods of this world in relationship to God – who is the source of it all. Our wants and desires then find their rightful place in the order of things and do not dominate our existence. There is joy and freedom in that. Do not lose heart, but persevere in your stewardship. In the long-run the eternal rewards will be, as St. Paul says in today's reading, "beyond all measure"!


