From the Pastor's desk:

Sanctuary Renovation

The ecclesiastical artist Jozef Reibesteijn was here a week ago on his way to work on a new church being built in Canmore, Alberta. He and Dennis Flores were working on the final touch for the wall behind the tabernacle, namely the words "Sanctus, Sanctus, Sanctus" which will be placed above the arch over the tabernacle. The floor tile installer, Vittorio Loconte was also here a week ago. He will begin the installation of the tiles in the main body of the church in July. It will take him three or four weeks to install and place the pews back in place. During that time we will have to offer the weekend Masses in the basement hall. This will necessitate some volunteers to help set up and take down the chairs because of the Wednesday evening bingo. We will also need some volunteers to help stack the pews. During the month of July, with the noise of the installation of the tiles, etc. we will not have adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. I hope that we will still be able to have the weekday Masses in the gathering area, but we will have to determine that when the time arrives. I do not want to impede the installation of the tiles or "get in the way" of the work being done in the church. I did not schedule any weddings or baptisms during the month of July. Also, no one is allowed to die during the floor installation!!!

The meal was very tasty, thanks to Budget Catering. We have Chris Handkamer to thank for all of her work in organizing the supper: planning, phoning and inquiring with various caterers, organizing the assistants, ticket sales with the CWL members, cleaning up and then taking the left-overs to the Sisters of Charity. When I thanked Chris, she replied "no big deal". I retorted that it was a big deal. Thank you Chris and all others who assisted you. The only disappointment for me was the fact that there were 44 tickets purchased which were not used. Aside from the empty spots, the \$16/plate translated into \$484 which the parish had to pay for the plates which were not used. That was after we were able to claim the \$220 from the \$5 bills from the 44 people who did not attend. Again, we had people asking for "last minute" tickets which we were not able to sell or give away because the tickets had already been purchased. What to do next year? Charge the cost of the plate which would be refunded at the door? Any ideas, then let me know.

<u>2 Corinthians 5:6-10</u> In the second reading, Paul speaks of living up to the gospel with courage. In this way, he can be confident when he appears before the judgment seat of Christ.

<u>Mark 4:26-34</u> In the Gospel, Jesus compares the kingdom of God to tiny seeds which mysteriously grown into ripened grain
