Mass Attendance during COVID

The Manitoba Government now permits gatherings of 25 people. This includes places of worship such as our parish. We have in the neighbourhood of 1,000 families here in St. Anthony's Parish. At weekday Masses there is less a problem of accommodating those who ask to attend; however weekend Masses offer a challenge. Hopefully, if Manitoba continues being free of any new corona cases the government will increase the number allowed to attend public gatherings. **In the interlude however, we would ask that those who have already attended a Sunday Mass allow others to attend Mass.** The Archbishop has extended the dispensation from attending Sunday Masses until 6 September. Thank you for your cooperation.

As of this weekend, July 6 & 7, we have returned to our regular Mass Schedule. People must continue to sign up in order to attend Mass.

St. Faustina Memorial

The Most Holy Trinity

Introduction To Penitential Rite: Today, as we celebrate Trinity Sunday, let us ask forgiveness for the times we've forgotten that we are created, redeemed, and sanctified in the image of God, and that, since our Baptism, we have shared in the love and life that is at the heart of the Trinity.

Exodus 34:4b-6, 8-9 In the first reading, Moses gains the special privilege of speaking with God face to face. But his words are not about himself, but about the people he serves.

2 Corinthians 13:11-13 In the second reading, Paul encourages the Corinthians to live in peace. He prays they will enjoy the gifts that come from the Trinity.

John 3:16-18 In the Gospel, Jesus proclaims that God loved the world so much that God gave for its salvation the gift of God's only Son.

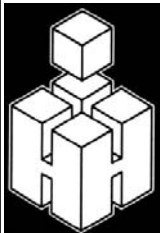
