

#### October: pray the rosary & prayer to St. Michael

There are many ways in which you can participate in "A Day to Remember Priests". Here are some suggestions:

A Spiritual Bouquet: What is a Spiritual Bouquet for Priests? A spiritual bouquet is nothing more than a card with a list of prayers and/or spiritual devotions that were (or will be) offered for a particular person – in this case a priest. It is a terrific way to show gratitude for your priest and a lovely way to express your appreciation and support for his vocation. Print out or pick up (available at your parish office) one of the "A Spiritual Bouquet for a Priest" cards. Mark on the card how many offerings you will be making and post it where everyone in your family will see it and be reminded to contribute to the bouquet.

<u>Pray the family rosary</u> for your priest and mention him by name in each Hail Mary "...pray for Fr. N now and at the hour of his death, Amen."

<u>Offer up</u> as many sacrifices, Holy Hours, Masses and Divine Mercy Chaplets as you wish.




