From the Pastor's desk:

Sharing God's Gifts

I was speaking to some parishioners from other parishes and they told me that they were nearing their Sharing God's Gifts goal for this year. This was a reminder to me that we here at St. Anthony's need to become more serious about reaching our own parish target as we approach the end of the year. It all comes down to the fact that we are blessed by God in order that we might be generous in giving back to God through others. The generosity of God in terms of blessings are meant to be fluid. This means that they are not only to flow to us, they are also to flow through us. I read recently that according to the World Bank, that if all you own is only worth \$2,200 that you are wealthier than half of the world. I would imagine that each of us fits into that category. If you have already contributed to Sharing God's Gifts, then thank you. If you have not, then please ask the Holy Spirit to guide you into the amount that you should give. No doubt, God will bless us as we give.

Purgatory and Indulgences

We are approaching the month of November when we commemorate All Saints Day and All Souls Day. During November we remember in a particular way those who have died, both recently and a long time ago. We Catholics are privileged to believe in purgatory where the Love of God tempers the Justice of God. I read an article written by the late Archbishop Fulton Sheen. He wrote that those who die in the state of venial sins are plunged into that purifying place which we call purgatory, where they might have their stained baptismal robes washed to be fit to enter into the spotless purity of heaven. On the other hand, purgatory is a place not only where the Love of God tempers the Justice of God, but where the love of man may temper the injustice of man. Purgatory enables the hearts of those who are left behind to break the barriers of time and earth, to convert unspoken words into prayers, unburned incense into sacrifice, unoffered flowers into alms and undone acts of kindness into help for eternal life. Purgatory causes the bowed head to give way to a bent knee, a moment of silence to a moment of prayer, and the fading wreathe to the abiding offering of the sacrifice of that great Hero of heroes, Christ. Purgatory enables us to atone for our ingratitude because through our prayers, mortifications and sacrifices, it makes it possible to bring joy and consolation to the ones we love. Love is stronger than death and hence there should be love for those who have gone before us.

All Souls Indulgences. An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins. On All Souls Day (Nov. 2) a plenary (full) indulgence, applicable to the poor souls in purgatory, is granted to those who visit any parish church and those who recite one Our Father and one Credo.

On all the days from Nov. 1-8, a plenary indulgence, applicable to the poor souls in purgatory, is granted to those who visit a cemetery and pray for the departed.

Only one plenary indulgence can be granted per day. It is necessary to be in the state of grace, that is free from mortal sin. Holy Communion must be received each time the indulgence is sought. Prayers must be recited for the intentions of the Holy Father on each day the indulgence is sought. An Our Father, Hail Mary and Glory Be will suffice. We read in 2 Maccabees 12:45 that it is a holy and pious thought to pray for the dead. Therefore he, Judas Maccabee, made atonement for the dead, so that they might be delivered from their sin.

Some House Directives

Last weekend, following the Masses, the women's washroom was in a deplorable state. Water all over the sink counter, garbage on the floor, toilet paper wastefully used and not what one would expect to see in a woman's washroom. I expect that this was a result of children left unattended. Parents, please monitor your children while they are in the washroom and teach them good washroom behaviour.

On Tuesday, following catechism in the hall, the men's washroom had the urinal pucks taken out of the four urinals and smashed on the floor. Why children or teenagers in the religious education classes, learning how to be good Christians, would do something as wasteful, destructive and work provoking as this, is beyond me. 
