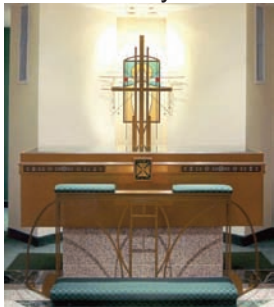
News in the Archdiocese

20 Years of Blessings & Graces

Twenty years ago, a holy gift was received in the Ukrainian Catholic Archeparchy of Winnipeg. On Sep 16 to the 22, the holy relics of Blessed Vasyl Velychkovsky were transferred from All Saints Cemetery to St. Joseph's Ukrainian Catholic Church. Since then, every Wednesday at 7 p.m., there has been a Blessed Vasyl Devotional Service. During the service, there are intercessory prayers for the needs of all participants and prayers that have been placed in the prayer box. Each service concludes with an anointing using Holy Oil blessed by relics of Blessed Vasyl.



To mark the 20th anniversary, come and join us in prayer on Wednesday, September 21, for the Acathist Hymn to Blessed Martyr Bishop Vasyl Velychkovsky at 7 p.m. at St. Joseph's Church and Shrine (250 Jefferson Avenue). The service will be followed by an informal gathering downstairs to share memories of that week that have impacted our lives. We look forward to having you join us in prayer and fellowship.

Bible study: Our next bible study will take place January 9 – April 3. What a perfect way to spend Lent and prepare for Easter! We will be studying the Psalms! The Book of the Psalms is a unique collection of the song-prayers of Israel. To study Psalms is to study prayer, ultimately to enter into prayer. The study will challenge participants to reflect on their own prayer and life experiences. Psalms I focuses on a selection of twenty-eight psalms divided into three categories:

- Psalms of Descriptive Praise
- Psalms of Trust or Confidence
- Wisdom Psalms

“Psalms of descriptive praise, also known as hymns, praise God for his ongoing, regular care of the world and humanity” (from p. 8 of the commentary). Psalms of trust or confidence reinforce the belief that the God who made and loves us will protect us in difficult situations. Wisdom psalms are an acknowledgment of God’s justice in the right ordering of human affairs.

Psalms II focuses on a selection of twenty-eight psalms divided into three categories:

- Royal Psalms
- Psalms of Lament
- Psalms of Declarative Praise

The royal psalms reflect the belief in ancient Israel that the king was “anointed” by God (i.e. a messiah) to be “the instrument of God’s concern for the people” (from the commentary, p. 79). Psalms of lament express the sorrow of the soul in distress and of the individual’s and the community’s need to turn to God in order to be healed or rescued. Psalms of declarative praise are prayers of thanksgiving that praise God for rescue or healing from dire situations.
