FOURTH SUNDAY OF THE EASTER SEASON

APRIL 29TH, 2012

Acts 4:7-12, 17-19; 1 John 3:1-2; John 10:11-18



Table fellowship reveals the depth of humanity. In today's gospel, the touching, human scene of Jesus taking bread and fish and eating it with his disciples drives home the fact that ghosts don't eat—humans do—and it reassures the disciples that the Risen Lord is truly in their midst. No theological or dogmatic assertion will prove this to them. Rather, the striking humanity of Jesus, at table, will finally convince them that he is alive. Surely this is a story reflecting the Eucharist....a summary of Jesus' life, a call to lay down one's life for others. It is not only that the person sharing the cup and the broken bread establishes a union with Christ, a further union is established through the 'partaking' of the same loaf—the union between all the members of the celebrating community. The unity expressed here is not just a matter of human conviviality; it is a gift given in the breaking of bread, a sharing in the body of Christ. The Eucharist makes the members of the body celebrate their oneness, a oneness experienced on three levels: ONE IN CHRIST, ONE WITH EACH OTHER, AND ONE IN SERVICE TO THE WORLD.
