From The Pastors Desk...

When I wrote the last "Pastor's Message" I could not have imagined how everything around our Feast Day would play out. First of all, I express my immense gratitude to each and every person who made the celebrations possible. There were so many people who helped in the planning, setup, execution, and cleanup, of our Parish Picnic, the premiere of the Documentary, and the opening of Assumption Church on August 15—and all of it went better than I could have anticipated. In addition, Paul Mullins' release of his *Interim Report* on Assumption parish and the announcement that Al Quesnel has pledged up to \$5 million (in matching funds) added to the excitement of the weekend. I look forward to Mr. Mullins' release of the final report so that we can make decisions and start working towards our goals.

In the meantime, life goes on. It's one thing to face natural disasters, such as wildfires or flooding. Hurts coming from direct human action are harder to accept. Recently it was revealed that Cardinal McCarrick had committed sexual abuse, and shortly thereafter a Pennsylvania grand jury released a report which exposes horrific examples of sex abuse by clergy and cover-ups by hierarchy. (Pope Francis has responded with a letter that I describe in a bulletin insert.) It is easy to lose hope. I know that some people will leave the Church over this report.

In the gospel passage for this weekend we hear the end of the "Bread of Life" discourse. John tells us that many of Jesus' disciples could not accept his teaching on eating the flesh of the Son of Man and drinking his blood. He continues, "Because of this many of his disciples turned back, and no longer went about with him." For those early followers, Jesus' words were scandalous; they simply could not follow a person who could give such scandal. Even though the "scandal" of Jesus is lifegiving (and in no way like that of sex abuse) his followers did not understand it that way. Yet next weekend we hear a message of hope. Isaiah tells us that God will come and save us, giving healing and abundance. In the gospel passage from Mark, we hear that Jesus "has done everything well; he even makes the deaf to hear and the mute to speak." We constantly face choices in life. Today, for many people, that choice is whether to focus on the scandalous behaviour or the hope that God offers. Our Parish Vision calls us to be a beacon of mercy, service, and discipleship. May others know God's healing and hope through us.

Pastoral Plan Revisited For a series of weeks, the bulletin will contain a brief description of Foundational Ministries:

Foundational Ministries are the essential ongoing work of the parish which most often remain stable and consistent. Every parish has the same foundational ministries, yet the specific goals in those areas may be different between parishes.

be different between parishes. **"Sacraments and Worship"**—The first foundational ministry is that of the parish's fundamental task of offering the sacraments of the Church and meaningful worship. Remembering that the Eucharist is the source and summit of our faith, the pastoral council discerned some specific goals to enhance that area of our parish life. Involvement and engagement are key to a person's sense of belonging. It is our mission as the baptized to offer ourselves in service of building the Kingdom of God. Considering these principles the council identified a goal to "call forth and train 50 new liturgical ministers by June of 2019", which includes greeters, ushers, lectors, extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist, altar servers, and weekend food and fellowship servers. Also recognizing that the faith formation of children is a responsibility of the family, supported and empowered by the parish; the council named as a second goal "to ensure that all of the children's sacramental programs include a parent component by October of 2018". Please pray for the implementation of all the goals of our pastoral plan, and participate in whatever ways you may be called, to help them to be achieved.

Over the last several bulletins various ministries under the umbrella of Parish Hospitality have been described, with the hope that each person will pray and reflect on their personal spirit of hospitality and how they might be called to serve in specific ministries in that regard. The ministries of door greeters, pew greeters, ushers, and food and fellowship have been highlighted, in order to encourage all to discern if this is a ministry that aligns with their gifts. In the fall, parishioners will be given an opportunity to be trained and join in these hospitality efforts. The registration process will take place through September, and a training workshop is planned for September 29th for all who choose to serve in these particular groups. Yet, hospitality goes beyond these organized ministries. It is not only receiving people at the door of our church, but receiving them in the interior of our hearts. It is our aim to give all a space where they can feel free to arrive, to be, to feel at home, to rest, to play, to speak, to be silent, to eat and to share. This makes us hospitable with those that suffer, those who are strangers, those who may be new to our community. Each of us is a pilgrim to be welcomed, and a host to welcome others. As we contemplate our new pastoral plan, and explore more deeply how we can live out intentional discipleship, may we open ourselves to the movement of the Holy Spirit in our hearts transforming us so that we receive all as Christ receives us - just as we are.
