TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Prov. 9:1-6; Ps. 33; Eph. 5:15-20; John 6:51-58



Today Jesus himself teach us about the Eucharist. Speaking directly and in concrete terms, he promises the gift of eternal life to those who feed sacramentally on him, giving himself freely for the world's life. The crowd objects to this mystery beyond it comprehension, even as our faith is tested by this difficult word of Jesus. He does not reply with rational arguments, but again insists that we nourish ourselves with the bread he gives. Bread and wine for our eating and drinking are the visible signs of the presence of the living Christ crucified and risen. The Eucharist, given at the Last Supper, is the active presence of the Lord with us, the memorial of his saving death and the promise to us of glory for ever. The first reading invites us to abandon our human ways and partake of the banquet prepared by God's wisdom. Ephesians exhorts us to redeem the world we live in by giving continual thanks to God. Our praise reaches highest expression in the Mass, where it is united with Jesus perfect offering.



Dear Parishioners,

When you read this I will be in Jerusalem once again visiting the various holy sites and visiting several Palestine Christian families that I have known for many years. Be assured of my prayers for all of you and the needs of our parish especially at the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, the traditional site of Calvary and the Tomb of the Resurrection. As I mentioned last

Sunday, we now have our bells restored and will ring out the traditional Angelus daily at 12 noon and 6 pm as well as calling all to worship before each Mass. My thanks to the Assumption Community Association for paying the expenses for this project. For those not familiar with this group, they were first organized at the former St. Patrick's Church to provide both the funds and volunteers for sacramental preparation of children. They continue that ministry on Monday evenings at HNM Church and fund the programme as well—a truly wonderful parish work. They do need new people to volunteer to teach the children (esp. students in the Faculty of Education). If interested, please phone the rectory and leave your name and we will make sure it is passed on to the leaders. There is a set curriculum so no need to “create” the programme yourself. Great way to volunteer.....

I did participate in a conference call with the Bishop, Diocesan Staff and Fr. Tom Rosica concerning the future of the restoration project. The audit of AHTF will take place in September and we will then have news for you concerning moving forward. Our next meeting will take place here at Assumption on September 7th. I fully realize that it appears as if no steps have been taken but assure you that once the Fall sets in, you will indeed have more substantial information and be involved in the process as we move forward.

And finally a thank you to those who helped with last's weeks celebration of our Feast Day....and the cake was great!
