# Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time—June 10th, 2018

## From The Pastors Desk...

My mom was one of 14 siblings and my dad one of eight, and we are 78 cousins in my generation: 22 on my father's side and 55 on my mother's, and 49 of those live in Belgium. As a child, my mom used to tell us stories about her family. I think that because they were so far away, she felt it all the more important that we knew about our origins. She did such a good job at this that when my sister and brother-in-law were visiting last year, and we had dinner in Toronto with the son of one of my Belgian cousins, we found that Margaret knew more about our family than Max, who grew up there. And on my dad's side, needless to say, for us Italians *famiglia* is very important! Family was very important in Jesus' culture as well, so it is not unusual that Jesus' family would be concerned about him when people started thinking he had "gone out of his mind". And then Mark tells us in this weekend's gospel that some were even accusing Jesus of being possessed by the devil. Of course his family was concerned!

Jesus' response to this concern is rather shocking: "Who are my mother and my brothers?' And looking around at those who sat around him, he said, 'Here are my mother and my brothers! Whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother." Think about the implications of that. If Jesus is God's Son and we are Jesus' sisters and brothers, then we are God's children as well. And although we are not God in the way that Jesus is, there are so many instances in Scripture where we hear that God dwells in us, and that we are temples of the Holy Spirit. All it takes is for us to do God's will. That is a daunting task at times, yet the rewards are definitely great.

Last weekend a member of the Pastoral Council presented our pastoral plan. Over these past two years we have been trying to discern God's will for us as a parish family, and in preparation for being a part of a "family of parishes". How do we best reach out to our sisters and brothers in need? How can we "be a beacon of mercy, service, and discipleship"? In short, how are we becoming more a part of Jesus' family? And how about you? What is your role in this family?

#### Hospitality ministers at mass: "Don't we just call them ushers anymore?"

The answer to that is "Yes" and "No". The ministry of the usher is indeed a ministry of hospitality. Traditionally the usher assists people in finding seats, locating washrooms, reconciliation spaces, etc., and tends to their needs as they are presented. Ushers make the gathering and offering of gifts easy by taking up the collection and organizing the offertory procession. They also guide the Communion procession, and set the tone for our entry into the mission field of the world as we leave the church, bulletin in hand. All of those tasks, done joyfully with a welcoming spirit, offer contribution to the hospitality of the parish.

More recently, as we seek to understand and respond to the decline in mass attendance, the ministry of hospitality has emerged as a variety of different roles. When there are a number of different tasks, requiring diverse personal gifts and attributes, new titles, aligned with specific tasks, appear in ministry training literature.

The ministry of "Greeter" focuses on the intentional welcoming outreach of the first encounter in the parking lot (or street) and at the doors of the church. The greeter is the face, the smile, the handshake, that tells the person arriving that they are indeed welcome in our church, and that we are happy that they have come to celebrate Eucharist with us. This welcome reminds people that we are not gathering for a private devotion, but for a communal celebration. A joyful greeting, followed by a welcome from a gracious usher who notices the needs that come with the people (young children, elderly, newcomers, etc.), gives a sense of belonging that feeds the individual's experience of Jesus among his people. Both of these "First Responder" hospitality ministries are vital to parish life, yet they are not identical, and not everyone has the gifts and personal attributes for both.

Here at Assumption we are hoping to grow many hospitality ministries, of which the "Greeters" and "Ushers" play a very significant role. Consider if your gifts, disposition and attributes are suited for either of these roles. Pray about it and stay tuned for details on organization and formation in upcoming bulletins.

The first over 35 "Catholic Life Support" gathering was a wonderful experience of fellowship and sharing on our experiences of living our Catholic identity in our everyday experience. We welcome others to join in for conversation with fellow Catholic Christians on whatever joys, challenges, experiences, questions, you would like to bring up.

The format is simple: welcome, Scripture, and conversation. We will throw in a few snacks too! The next gathering will be on Monday, June 11<sup>th</sup> in Rosary Hall from 6:30-8:00pm. As the group grows there may be additional groups formed so let us know your available days and times, to accommodate your schedule. Contact Jean Beneteau for more information.
