Body and Blood of Christ—June 3rd, 2018

From The Pastors Desk...

One of the defining factors of Catholicism is our belief in the Eucharist. In that sacrament, in Communion, the living body and blood of the risen Christ are present under the forms of bread and wine. We are nourished by our very God. In a very real way, to be Catholic is to be in relationship with a God who loves us so much that he becomes our very food. And if it's true that "You are what you eat," the implications are enormous.

I recently had the privilege of watching Fr. Tom Rosica interview Jim Forest for an episode of Salt + Light TV's Witness program. Mr. Forest is an internationally known peace activist, who has written biographies of Servant of God Dorothy Day, Fr. Thomas Merton, Fr. Daniel Berrigan, and other notable figures known for their stands for peace and justice. When Fr. Tom asked Jim what sustained him as an activist for many years, he quickly responded, "The Eucharist." He said that he starves to death without it. He went on to say, "you begin to let the Eucharist shape your life. You begin to think, 'Am I preparing for Communion?' That's leading in to Communion. 'Am I being thankful for Communion?' and that is preparing for Communion. It's just a constant cycle that centres on Communion. Being in Communion. The Eucharist is the sacrament of communion: communion with God, communion with the other person, communion with the beggar standing outside the church, communion with your wife, if you're having a dispute, communion with your children if you're having troubles in your relationship with them. We're surrounded by areas that can go off the tracks. Communion helps us get back on the tracks."

This coming Friday and Saturday we celebrate the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, followed by the Immaculate Heart of Mary. These two celebrations remind us of God's tender love for each of us, to the point of dying for us. God's tenderness and mercy are limitless. Indeed, it is out of God's love that we have the gift of the Eucharist, to "get us back on the tracks" and to remember that we indeed are called to be what we eat: the presence of God to one another, in communion with one another.

We may not know what you have to offer unless you come forward, so please consider if God may be calling you to this planning, supporting commission of local disciples.
