SOLEMNITY OF THE BIRTH OF JOHN THE BAPTIST

JUNE 24

Isaiah 49:1-6; Ps. 139; Acts 13:22-26; Luke 1:57-66



The Canticle of Zechariah, which is part of today's gospel, tells us what John will be like. He will be a prophet (in Isaiah's words, a "sharp-edged sword"), will go before the Lord and will be the herald of God's compassion for humanity. Like every birth, John's contains a vision of the future, and, like every birth, this future can be marked by suffering and tragedy. John will "complete his course" (Acts) by being brutally murdered by a scheming ruler (Herod Antipas). As death nears, John is a model not only of one who heard God's word and lived, but of one who dies in great faith. From his prison cell he dispatches his disciples to ask Jesus if he really was "he who is to come," only to receive the answer, "Go and tell John what you have seen and heard: the blind receive their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, and the deaf hear, the dead are raised up, the poor have good news preached to them" (Lk. 7:19-22). While both are on the staff of Assumption University, this is another move to coordinate our programming. I want to express my thanks to Fr. Tom Rosica in offering Tom and Andrea services to us without adding to our own finances.

A thank you to all those parishioners who came out to paint our fence. Project was completed last Sat. It does look good and your contribution saved the parish a good amount of money. God bless.....esp. the children who were part of the group. I believe a good time was had by all !!!

Finally, remember that we welcome the parishioners of Blessed Sacrament Parish and the 9 am worshipping community of Holy Name of Mary to our community the weekend of July 7/8. Let us open not just our church doors to them but also open arms of welcome.
