From the Pastor's Desk...

When I was growing up we had one phone in the house, a black rotary dial phone that lived on an end table near the couch. It was always there, and could be used at any time. When we were out of power for days after a hurricane, the phone still worked. Today I have a "smart phone". I've come to depend on it for all kinds of things. I ask Siri to remind me to do things. I can look up anything on the internet. My calendar is there, as well as social media, email, all kinds of apps—and even a phone! It has a battery that needs to be recharged; a full charge lasts less than a day for me. I have a charging cable on my desk, another at my bedside table, and one in my car. If the battery runs down to nothing, the phone is of no use.

In this weekend's gospel passage, Jesus spends time at the well with the Samaritan woman. He tells her that those who drink of the water he gives will never be thirsty. So she replies, "Sir, give me this water, so that I may never be thirsty or have to keep coming here to draw water." I think she doesn't quite grasp what Jesus is saying. It is true that what he gives satisfies like nothing else can. What she doesn't get is that it's not just a one-time encounter with Jesus. Even though Jesus, the living water, satisfies our thirst once and for all, it doesn't mean we don't have to keep coming back to him. Instead, I think we realize that he is the *only* thing that can truly satisfy, and we will never thirst for anything else once we've tasted him. Yet we are like "batteries". We have to keep coming back to Jesus to be recharged, or our lives just don't work. We need to spend time with him in prayer. We need to be fed by him in the Eucharist. Without returning to Jesus regularly for a recharge, we will be like my cell phone with a spent battery, of no use to anyone.

In these days when the situation with the COVID-19 virus is occupying our minds, I encourage you to keep coming back to Jesus to recharge your hearts, your minds, your souls. If you have any signs of illness, recharge with private prayer, with Mass on TV, perhaps by calling a friend and praying by phone. Love of neighbour impels us to be aware of how our actions may impact others. Let us support one another in prayer.
