From the Pastor's Desk...

When I first started college, I lived with my aunt and uncle in Dallas. My aunt had a subscription to the National Enquirerwhich has been in the news itself lately because of purported ties with Donald Trump and possible blackmail of Jeff Bezos, the owner of Amazon and one of the richest men in the world. Every week when it would come, my uncle would complain that my aunt wasted her money on it ... and then he would read it cover to cover! Besides two-headed men, the encounters with extra-terrestrials, etc., the focus was usually on scandals about famous people: who was getting divorced, who was cheating on their spouse, who went into rehab for alcohol or drugs. Of course, that publication is only one of many that earns lots of money on what might be simply described as gossip. We tend to love hearing juicy tidbits, unflattering things about people. At its very core, I think we love to hear about other people's weaknesses or misfortunes, because it makes us feel just a bit better about ourselves.

We're not the only ones who do that. I think we can find that same attitude in this weekend's gospel passage. People "told Jesus about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices." (We know nothing about Pilate slaughtering people while they were offering sacrifice, nor of the tower falling on people, but they could very well have happened.) The point Jesus makes is that they were no more nor less guilty than anyone else. Add to that Jesus' parable about the gardener wanting to work with the fig tree another year to give it yet another chance to bear fruit, and we have a powerful message from Jesus about attitude adjustment: Don't worry about those other people; don't compare yourselves to them and don't judge them. Just keep working on yourself. If you are going to do any comparing, compare how much you grow in your own life. I think that is an important aspect of humility: to refrain from comparing ourselves to others and to measure our own progress.

This Lent, as we continue our series called *Attitude Adjustment* I invite you to take stock of yourself. See where you have grown in the past year, and where you may have become complacent or stagnant. True humility includes an honest appraisal of ourselves and a realization that with our efforts and God's grace we can continue to grow into the person God wants each of us to be.
