FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT Jeremiah 31:31-34; Hebrews 5:7-9; John 12:20-23 *March 25th, 2012*

To Gaze Upon the Face of Jesus

In today's reading from Hebrews, we are presented with a Jesus "who offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save....and he was heard..." What does this image of Jesus teach us today? Far from creating an abyss, our times of struggle have become the privileged place of our encounter with him, and not only with him, but with God himself. The consequence is that from now on, not one of us can be bowed down under a painful situation without

finding that Christ is, by that very fact, on our side. Jesus was 'heard' because of his 'reverence': or his 'submission'. And we are given the consolation that we, too, will be heard because of our own persistence in prayer, our reverence before God and our pious submission to his will for us. --Fr. Thomas Rosica, CSB



Last week was a wonderful moment in our parish's Lenten journey as we experienced the healing presence of God in both of the great Sacraments of the Sick and Reconciliation. We had already been given a "transfiguration" experience of Jesus as risen Lord, whom those disciples saw on that Mount, as we heard on the Second Sunday of Lent. Our journey through these weeks is preparing us for the

week that begins next Sunday (Holy Week) and for our parish to indeed walk through death to new life in the Great Three Days of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil.

I do hope that the parish will benefit from our financial report this weekend. This will be an annual event and really summarizes the year-long work of our very astute Financial Advisory Committee. We do this during Lent as part of our accountability to the parish for your generosity in sustaining our work and ministry.

I want to look ahead on two additions to our Holy Week services. The first is a collection that will be taken up at the Holy Thursday Mass. This collection will be given over entirely to the St. Vincent de Paul Society in our parish. Their work in providing care for those in our area is indeed a visible sign of the gospel of this night...the washing of the disciples' feet by Jesus and his command that we do the same. Thank you for considering this.

Secondly, Campus Ministry will be hosting a Fish Fry after the Good Friday Liturgy. Even though this is a day of great solemnity, it is still a good time also to be aware that the Lord's saving Passion is the very birth of this new community of believers as we will hear in John's Passion. So it seems a fitting moment that, having liturgically renewed the Lord's passion, we gather to have a simple meal in recognition that our parish is that continuing community born from his saving side on the cross ('and there flowed blood and water from his side, the sacramental life of the church").




In Town for Good Friday?


