From the Pastor's Desk...

A few years back I heard a talk by Fr. Richard Rohr, a Franciscan, where he said that the Israelites were God's chosen people for a very specific purpose: God wanted them to know what it felt like to be "chosen", to be "special", *in order for them to then teach others how special they were*. For me, that's a powerful concept. They weren't "chosen" in the sense that they were the only ones to be saved; they had to know what it felt like to be "chosen" in order to pass that on to others. It is so logical and yet so counterintuitive as well. When I feel "special" or "chosen", I want to bask in that luxury of knowing how loved I am. It's easier to just sit back and enjoy. I think that's what many of the Jews did. And it took something powerful to jar some of them out of their comfort zone and into action.

I think that's what we have in this weekend's reading from Acts. Paul and Barnabas have started their missionary journeys and are now in Antioch, in modern-day Syria. First they speak about Jesus in the synagogue. The crowds are interested, but the officials are "filled with jealousy; and blaspheming, they contradicted what was spoken by Paul." That was the catalyst for Paul to move out of his comfort zone of sticking with the "chosen" and go out to the rest of society. Luke tells us, "Then both Paul and Barnabas spoke out boldly, saying, 'It was necessary that the word of God should be spoken first to you. Since you reject it... we are now turning to the Gentiles."" That is *groundbreaking*. Now the non-Jews can learn that they, too, are chosen! It is hard for us today, in our culture, to grasp the importance of that decision. It is what set the stage for the great missionary thrust of Christianity.

And that is what we are called to do as well: to move out of our comfort zones and become evangelizers, to preach the good news. As much as I consider myself committed to the faith, I sometimes cringe at the thought. But then I realize that being an evangelizer doesn't necessarily mean going around talking about Jesus. It means to be a bearer of *good news*, from the Greek *eu*, good, and *angelion*, news. So I ask myself: Am I a bearer of good news? Are people glad to see me show up or do they sigh or walk away? I pray that we may be true evangelizers, bearers of Good News to all we meet.

I would also like to wish all mothers a happy Mother's Day! Thank you for being true evangelizers, bearers of good news and givers of life to so many people.
