THIRTY-FIRST SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

November 4, 2012



Deuteronomy 6: 2-6; Ps.
18; Hebrews 7:23-28;
Mark 12:28-34

What does God want most? Jesus' statement of the twin commandment to love God and our neighbor seems so commonplace. Yet the linking of these two commands of the Old Testament, to love God wholeheartedly and our neighbor as ourselves, was new. They still demand so much that we will never fulfill them perfectly. This teaching is placed near the end of Jesus' ministry; soon he will live out his whole-

hearted love on the cross. The scribe who questioned Jesus, had recognized someone close to God, and he repeats Jesus' answer to meditate on it. Jesus invites him to accept God's rule over his life. The scribe realizes that ritual worship, essential as it is, is worthless without love. The letter to the Hebrews explains that Christ has been consecrated our perfect high priest and saviour eternally because of his loving offering of himself made once and for all. Every Mass makes us present to Jesus' unique sacrifice and draws us into his perfect priestly offering of praise and love to God.



This past week, Campus Ministry attended the National Gathering of the Canadian Catholic Students Association, just down the road at Brescia and Kings Colleges in London. Approximately 80 students gathered from across Canada under the theme: "Witnessing the Gospel in Word and Deed."

Auxiliary bishop of Toronto, William McGrattan, was the keynote speaker with several memorable ideas. Perhaps the most profound to me was quoted from recent documents on the New Evangelization: "The new form of martyrdom today is dialogue." It requires listening and dying to self and often comes with great criticism from within.

Secondly, in speaking about the Sacrament of the Word, he told students that while we rightly get very concerned when a morsel of the Eucharist falls to the ground accidentally, we often pay no attention to the Word of God that falls on inattentive ears.

Lastly, he quoted recently studies published in a new book entitled, "Hemorrhaging Faith" that cited four qualities that lead to faith development. One of those is intergenerational environments, like those found in parishes. McGrattan warned against campus ministry programs segregating their activity and existence apart from parish environments – something we have worked very hard not to do here in Windsor.

Let us all continue to pray for the future of our parish and for the Church of Canada.

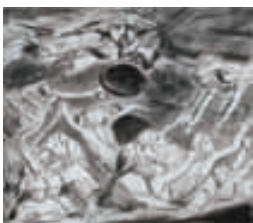

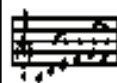
