# **Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time** September 27th, 2015

his past Sunday while he was in Cuba, Pope Francis set aside his prepared homily FROM THE and spoke off the cuff about poverty. I ASTOR'S DESK think it's worth quoting what he said:

It occurred to Cardinal Jaime to speak a very uncomfortable word, extremely uncomfortable, that even goes against the cultural structure, so to speak, of the world. He said poverty. And he repeated it various times. I think that the Lord wanted us to hear it various times and to receive it in our hearts. The spirit of the world doesn't know this word, doesn't like it, hides it - not out of purity, but out of disdain. And if one has to sin and offend God so that one isn't hit by poverty, he does it. The spirit of the world doesn't love the path of the Son of God, who emptied himself, made himself poor, made himself nothing, humiliated himself to be one of us.

As I write this, the Pope is on a plane to Washington; I imagine that by the time this is printed, he will have spoken strongly to the US Congress and to the United Nations about economic injustices, among other things.

These are difficult words to hear-just like the words from the Letter of James proclaimed in this weekend's second reading. As individuals and as a society (both civil and religious) we look for comfort, for security, for assurance that we will not be in need. Those who amass riches are the ones who are "successful". The ones who are poor are "failures".

If we truly let those challenges touch our hearts, it will make most of us very uncomfortable-at least, I hope it does. It is such a leap of trust to let all our securities go and just trust in God. I want \$10 million to restore the Church. I want to be assured that Assumption will be around for many years to come to respond to the needs of the people of Windsor. I also want to be a faithful follower of Jesus. Glib answers don't solve anything. We are challenged to somehow reconcile our existence in today's world with the challenges of being authentic disciples. I pray for guidance for each one of us.

### **Reception of Holy** Communion

This week we address a practical question: what is the proper posture for communion in the Diocese of London? But before addressing the practical let me say a few words about the reception of communion during liturgy.

Unlike personal prayer, which one does privately, liturgy (the Mass) is a communal act of worship: priest united with lay people in an act of worshiping the Father, through the Son, in the Holy Spirit. We do, say and sing things together as the one Body of Christ.

Think of the words "community" (common unity) and "communion" (common union). To receive Holy Communion is between God and us, not a private act between just God and me. At communion there are some ways we foster that sense of common unity. First, we sing with one voice from the time that the Presider receives communion. Another is that together we process to be nourished on Christ's Body & Blood: nourishment only God can provide. In the Diocese of London we also maintain a common posture throughout: once we have entered the communion procession we remain standing until everyone has received communion, then together we kneel or sit. This should happen as the priest and other communion ministers begin returning to the altar; do not wait until the Presider is seated or the tabernacle door is closed. That can be our time for private prayer and silent reflection.
