I love it when I know that people like me. I crave that. I'm also embarrassed by it. In one-on-one counselling with people, in homilies, even speaking to friends or to myself in my own mind, I can say all kinds of things about standing up for values, about being honest, about how sometimes standing up for what is right entails rejection. When it comes to really doing it, though, I find myself constantly being challenged by what I think you might think—as if I could read your mind and actually *knew* what you might be thinking! That is one of my many weaknesses. And yet, it is one of my assets. *Because* I want people to like me, I often do a pretty good job of giving them reasons to do so. I often try to do as Jesus says, to be first by being the servant.

Now, none of this is conscious at the moment. It is only in reflection, in moments of prayer, when I look back at my day or my life, that I can see the underlying motives for some of my actions. And yet, I firmly believe that God can use that. God can take all my twisted thoughts and reasoning and unconscious needs and use them to build up the Kingdom, for the advancement of God's people. Or, as the traditional saying goes, God writes straight with crooked lines.

In these weeks we're hearing from the Letter of James. Today he is clear and to the point: a lot of the mess outside, the problems in society, stem from the fact that we have problems inside. This week might be a good time to take an honest look at our own weaknesses and contradictions and failings—not to beat ourselves up over them, but rather to expose them to ourselves, so that God can better use them for our healing and the building up of the Kingdom. Who knows how far the healing may spread?

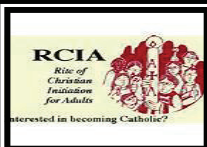
CATECHISM REGISTRATION

LITURGY CORNER

Why liturgy matters

The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy states "every liturgical celebration, because it is an action of Christ the priest and of His Body which is the Church, is a sacred action surpassing all others."(7) It places the celebration of the liturgy at the very core of the Christian life, stating "the liturgy is the summit toward which the activity of the Church is directed; at the same time it is the font from which all her power flows." (10)

The Mass is where everything comes together. All our ministries (education, caring for the poor, health care, etc.) flow from our celebration of the Eucharist, and bring us back to it. When we lose the centrality of Christ we risk becoming a country club or social services agency. Such ventures are good, but the mission Jesus entrusted to his Church is much greater. Pope Francis warns us against becoming do-gooders and losing sight of why we do good: we seek to continue the mission Jesus Christ began and entrusted to his Church. At Eucharist we are nourished and empowered for that mission.
