#### Pontifical Good Friday Collection

The Good Friday Collection on April 15, 2022 is requested by the Holy See to help maintain the Christian sites of the Holy Land and to support the Church in the pastoral, educational, and social works that contribute to a sustained Christian presence in the land where Jesus the Christ once walked. Please give as best you can to support this Church and the Christian community.

#### Good Friday is a day of Fasting and Abstinence

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are the 2 days in of abstinence Canada where all Catholics who are 14 years old and above are obliged to abstain from meat. All Catholics between 18 and 60 are required to fast on these days. There are no specific guidelines for what "fasting" means in Canada, but as an example of what a fast might look like, in the United States, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. Those who can are encouraged to maintain the fast through Holy Saturday in anticipation of the Resurrection of our Lord.

### Did You Know? Easter Vigil #2

After the Liturgy of Light, the Easter Vigil continues with the Liturgy of the Word. A total of 9 readings (7 Old Testament, 1 New Testament, and 1 Gospel) and 7 Responsorial Psalms are provided. The Word of God takes up a significant portion of the Easter Vigil Celebration because we recount God working throughout salvation history, and hear about all of the wonders that God has done throughout the ages. In the readings we hear the story of Creation, the Sacrifice of Isaac, the Exodus from Egypt, and then we hear from the Prophets and the promise of God to send a Savior and redeem his people. After the Old Testament readings, the Gloria is sung and the lights in the church are turned on. Light and darkness have a big significance in the Easter Vigil, and it symbolizes our waiting in darkness until the light of Christ comes into the world.

Following the Gospel and homily, the initiation of new Catholics takes place. We pray the Litany of Saints, the Baptismal Water is blessed, the Elect and Candidates make the profession of faith, and then they are Baptized and Confirmed by the Holy Spirit. Everyone in the church will then light their own candles, and we all renew our own baptismal promises together. Many of us were baptized as infants, and our parents made these promises on our behalf, but at the Easter Vigil, we renew our baptismal promises for ourselves. (N.B. A plenary indulgence is granted to the faithful who, at the celebration of the Easter Vigil or on the anniversary of their own Baptism, renew their baptismal vows. The other conditions for an indulgence to be fulfilled are: prayer for the Holy Father, receive Holy Communion and sacramental confession within 20 days, and to be free from attachment to sin).

Following the Sacraments of Initiation, the Liturgy of the Eucharist takes place. During the distribution of Holy Communion, the newly baptized and confirmed complete their initiation by receiving their First Holy Communion. The Easter Vigil is the greatest of all celebrations in the year of the Church. If you have not attended it yet, then do consider coming, and experiencing the highest solemnity and cornerstone of our faith, the Resurrection of Jesus from the dead.

#### A reflection for Palm Sunday

From the *Diary of St. Faustina, 642*: "This Sunday, I experienced in a special way the sentiments of the most sweet Heart of Jesus. My spirit was there where Jesus was. I saw Jesus riding on a donkey's foal, and the disciples and a great multitude with branches in their hands joyfully accompanying the Lord Jesus. Some strewed them before His feet where He was riding, while others raised their branches in the air, leaping and jumping before the Lord and not knowing what to do for joy. And I saw another crowd which came out to meet Jesus, likewise with joyful faces and with branches in their hands, and they were crying out unceasingly with joy. There were little children there also. But Jesus was very grave, and the Lord gave me to know how much He was suffering at the time. And at that moment, I saw nothing but only Jesus, whose Heart was saturated with ingratitude."

Today we share in the joy of Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem because it means that our salvation is near at hand. Let us strive to console the heart of Jesus, keeping him company in our hearts during this week, and not forgetting the great love he has for us to willingly enter into his passion and death for our salvation.
