## World Day of the Sick, February 11

Th ministry of Jesus to the sick is central to the life of the Church. February 11 (Memorial of Our Lady of Lourdes) highlights the healing ministry of the Church. It reminds us that service to the sick and suffering cannot be neglected. It recognizes the great efforts of doctors, nurses, health care institutions and pastoral care givers to restore health to those afflicted with illness and disease.



### Did you know? #5

After the Greeting, the priest may make some short introduction to the Mass of the day. "After the greeting of the people, the Priest, or the Deacon, or a lay minister may very briefly introduce the faithful to the Mass of the day."(GIRM 50) This time may be used to announce the intention of the Mass, or a Saint's feast day, or the Liturgical celebration of the day. Sometimes, the priest will say "Good morning" or some other greeting, but this is not essential for the Mass because he has just greeted everyone with *the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the Love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit.* 

### Pastoral References

All teacher candidates and those who are seeking a pastoral reference are encouraged to practice their faith in the parish where they wish to get a pastoral reference. The Catechism of the Catholic Church gives the minimum standard that is required of a practicing Catholic. The precepts of the Church are "the indispensable minimum in the spirit of prayer and moral effort, in the growth in love of God and neighbor." These are found in the <u>Catechism of the Catholic Church (2041-</u>2043).

### Icon of St. Joseph

An Icon of St. Joseph, blessed by Pope Francis, will be the centerpiece of a special prayer service at St. Paul's on Saturday **February 12<sup>th</sup>** following the 9:00am Mass. The prayer service flows from the Year of St. Joseph declared by Pope Francis in 2021 and is being sponsored by our parish Knights of Columbus 17397 with the help of Father John to honour St. Joseph and pray for his intercession in preserving, cultivating, and passing on the Catholic faith to future generations. Everyone is welcome to help us as we pray together. The icon will be displayed in our church until February 19<sup>th</sup> before it moves to the next parish.

### <u>Clarification of Cheques intended for the</u> St. Vincent de Paul Society

Occasionally we get a cheque in our collection that the donor intends to be split between the parish and the St. Vincent de Paul society (Eg: a \$125 cheque written out to the parish, intending to be \$100 to the parish and \$25 to the SSVP). This causes an accounting difficulty for the parish by issuing a \$125 tax receipt to the donor, but only \$100 is credited to our parish account. Sometimes, the SSVP gets a cheque made out to St. Paul's Parish which causes difficulty for them because they cannot deposit the cheque.

St. Paul the Apostle Parish and the St. Vincent de Paul Society are separate legal, financial, and administrative entities. Therefore, all cheque donations need to be written out to the intended recipient. All cheques written out to the parish will be deposited into the parish account, and the donor will be credited on their income tax receipt by the parish.
