Recognition of Lectors

On the 3rd Sunday of Ordinary Time (January 22-23, 2022), the scripture readings at Mass focus on the Word of God. In 2019, Pope Francis instituted 'The Sunday of the Word of God' to be held every year on the third Sunday of Ordinary Time. The Pope intended it to be a day dedicated to the celebration, reflection and dissemination of the Word.

This is a fitting day to have a recognition and presentation of the mandates for our parish Lectors who attended the Lector formation on November 20. At each Mass on the weekend of January 22-23, the lectors who are present will receive their mandate to carry out this ministry in our parish for 3 years. We thank all the Lectors for their ongoing commitment to our parish and this ministry.

Did you know? #3

Following the veneration of the altar, the priest and the people make the sign of the Cross. "*In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.*" The sign of the Cross is a mini profession of our faith. It is a reminder of our baptism in the name of the Trinity. It is a symbol of taking up our cross to follow Jesus as his disciple. It is the sign of the victory through the Cross that was won for us and is celebrated at each Mass. It is a sign of the defeat of evil through the Cross. The Sign of the Cross is used in virtually all blessings and prayers of our faith. The Sign of the Cross is both the *cross*, and our profession of *God in Three Persons* in whose name we pray.

When we pray in someone's name, we are declaring their presence and coming into their presence. This is a reminder that we gather, pray, and worship together, but not in our own name or under our own authority, but in the name of our God in Three Persons. We enter into the presence of God and call upon him and his name for our prayer. This is immensely significant and important - the Second Commandment is "Thou shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain." Each time we begin Mass, we pray *in the name of* the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

To make the sign of the cross, a person will touch their forehead, the center of their chest, their left shoulder, and their right shoulder, making a cross over themselves as they say the words. Making the sign of the cross is a tangible way to mark ourselves as Christ's; we belong to him and place ourselves under the sign of his cross. The Sign of the Cross is not just an opening and closing for prayer, but it is a prayer in itself which we should pray and do with faith and attention.

Notice about the Livestreaming Masses

With our new camera system, there may be times during the livestreamed Masses where you will be visible on the video feed. By attending the 9am Masses on Sunday, and other Masses that we livestream, you consent to having video footage taken by representatives of St. Paul the Apostle Parish and allow your likeness to be reproduced in materials that may be developed by The Roman Catholic Episcopal Corporation of the Diocese of Hamilton in Ontario, including Parish and Diocesan websites and social media platforms. We will publish the times in advance in our parish bulletin of the Masses that we will livestream. Photo and video coverage may also be archived.
