Everyone is welcome to help us as we pray together.

From the Pastor's Desk

A couple weeks ago, we received directives from the diocese in case a priest is in contact with someone who has tested positive for Covid-19, or he has symptoms of Covid-19. In these cases, we are to close the parish for 5 days to self-isolate, which may be extended if the symptoms do not improve for at least 24 hours. We are not to find a replacement priest to avoid any risk of exposure. The office will also be closed during this time. This is exacerbated by the fact that many covid symptoms are the same as the seasonal flu, which even if we catch that, we still need to close the parish due to lack of covid testing facilities. Fr. Gregory and I are doing what we can to limit our contacts outside the parish, especially in non-essential social settings so that we don't catch any illness. Realistically, we will probably catch it at some point, and in that case, we will make every effort to get the word out if we need to close. Let us pray that we are able to stay open, and for the end to this pandemic.

Pastoral References
