

Did you know? #2

After the priest processes to the altar, he venerates the altar with a kiss. This momentary action is a symbol of profound respect and is filled with meaning and significance.

Firstly, the Altar symbolically represents Jesus Christ, the "cornerstone" of the Church. The "Christian altar is the symbol of Christ himself, present in the midst of the assembly of his faithful." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1383) The altar is therefore not a distant or isolated image of Christ, but one standing in the midst of his people. For this reason, the altar must be given the most prominent location in a church, occupying a place which is "truly the center toward which the attention of the whole congregation of the faithful naturally turns." (GIRM 299) For similar reasons, "It is desirable that in every church there be a fixed altar, since this more clearly and permanently signifies Christ Jesus, the Living Stone." (GIRM 298)

The altar is also venerated because it is consecrated by the bishop with Sacred Chrism when the Church is dedicated. The altar is anointed with these words: "May the Lord by his power sanctify this altar, which by our ministry we anoint, so that, as a visible sign, it may express the mystery of Christ, who offered himself to the Father for the life of the world."

Additionally, over time relics of saints were inserted into the altar. The priest venerates the altar with a kiss, and also the relics contained therein. The origin of relics contained in the altar may be traced to St. John, who wrote in the Book of Revelation, "I saw under the altar the souls of those who had been slain for the word of God and for the witness they had borne"(6:90) The relics in the altar, especially those of martyrs who died for their faith, is a reminder that Christ has also died for us, which we celebrate at each Mass. The use of relics in the altar has fallen out of use in the recent decades, and there are no relics in the altar at St. Paul's.

We continue to show reverence to the altar by bowing to it when we pass in front, and you may have noticed that we have a bookstand at the presider's chair where the prayers before and after the Liturgy of the Eucharist are said. This is because the altar is a sacred place where the sacrifice of the Mass is celebrated and should not be used except for the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

From the Pastor's Desk

This weekend we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, and it is the last weekend that we will have the Christmas decorations in the church. Unlike the secular world that celebrates Christmas from about Halloween to December 25, we celebrate Christmas beginning on December 25. The Masses during the Octave of Christmas (December 25 – January 1) are like the Christmas Mass – we sing the Gloria, and if Eucharistic Prayer 1 is said, there is a special prayer (called an intervention) added for the specific liturgical feast of Christmas. If you celebrate the Twelve days of Christmas, that concludes on January 6, which is the Feast of the Epiphany, except when it is transferred to Sunday, as it is in Canada. The liturgical season of Christmas concludes on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord (today), after which the normal liturgical colour returns to green for Ordinary time. In the early church, the Christmas season was celebrated for 40 days until February 2, the feast of the Presentation of the Lord. In some countries (and some households), it is traditional to keep Christmas decorations up until this feast. This feast is sometimes called Candlemas, where candles would be brought to the church to be blessed as a sign of the light of Christ that entered the temple that day. No matter how long you leave your Christmas decorations up, we celebrate the mystery of Christ living among us each time we come to Mass and adore
