Did You know? RCIA Scrutinies

On the 3rd, 4th, and 5th Sunday of Lent, we will celebrate the scrutinies with the Elect who will be receiving the sacraments of initiation at the Easter Vigil. The scrutinies are an opportunity for the Elect to *scrutinize* their relationship with God before fully entering the church.

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults states:

"Because they are asking for the three sacraments of initiation, the elect must have the intention of achieving an intimate knowledge of Christ and his Church, and they are expected particularly to progress in genuine self-knowledge through serious examination of their lives and true repentance. In order to inspire in the elect a desire for purification and redemption by Christ, three scrutinies are celebrated. By these means, first of all, the elect is instructed gradually about the mystery of sin, from which the whole world and every person longs to be delivered and thus saved from its present and future consequences. Second, their spirit is filled with Christ the Redeemer, who is the living water (gospel of the Samaritan woman in the first scrutiny), the light of the world (gospel of the man born blind in the second scrutiny), the resurrection and the life (gospel of Lazarus in the third scrutiny). From the first to the final scrutiny the elect should progress in their perception of sin and their desire for salvation.

The scrutinies, which are solemnly celebrated on Sundays and are reinforced by an exorcism, are rites for self-searching and repentance and have above all a spiritual purpose. The scrutinies are meant to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect; to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good. For the scrutinies are celebrated in order to deliver the elect from the power of sin and Satan, to protect them against temptation, and to live them strength in Christ, who is the way, the truth, and the life. These rites, therefore, should complete the conversion of the elect and deepen their resolve to hold fast to Christ and to carry out their decision to love God above all. "

The first scrutiny will be celebrated at the 9am on Sunday March 20; the second scrutiny will be celebrated at the 11am on Sunday March 27; the third scrutiny will be celebrated at the 9am on Sunday April 3. We continue to pray for our Elect as they near the end of their preparation for the sacraments and look forward to living their new life as baptized Catholics.

Day of prayer for victims of sexual abuse

This Sunday, the Second Sunday of Lent, is the day dedicated by our Diocese as a day of prayer for the victims of sexual abuse. There are pamphlets at the back of the church with the Diocese's safeguarding protocol, and information about reporting sexual abuse and misconduct within our Diocese. We work together to bring those who have perpetrated abuse to justice, and we pray that those who have suffered abuse at the hands of another may find the healing power of Christ, and have their dignity restored through his grace.
